

PART 1 CRIME RATE 2009 - 2013



Violent Crime Rate 2009 - 2013



Property Crime Rate 2009 - 2013





Custodial Arrests 2009 - 2013





Robbery (2013)

- **4 fast food restaurants**





Aggravated Assault (2013)

- 51% were cases of family violence




Burglary (2013)

- **Burglaries decreased from 289 in 2012 to 256 in 2013**
- **80% of burglaries were in residential areas**
- **13% of all burglaries had no forced entry (doors unlocked).**




BMV (2013)







Definition: The Graph portrays the time it takes a police officer to respond to a priority one call from when the telephone call is received by the telecommunications operator to the time the first officer arrives at the location. An emergency call is defined as a call in which there exists an imminent threat to life and/or potentially severe property loss. The Patrol Division's goal is to have an average response time to priority one calls of less than five (5) minutes.






Number of Traffic Stops




2009 – 2013



2013 Yearly Biased Based Profiling Report

General Order #01-11

This report is given in order to comply with Senate Bill 1074, Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 2.132:

Requirements of Article. 2.132 subsection 6

(6) require collection of information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests resulting from those traffic stops, including information relating to:

- (A) the race or ethnicity of individual detained; and
- (B) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search; and

(7) require the agency to submit to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.
