

2011 - 2015





Violent Crime Rate 2011 - 2015





Property Crime Rate 2011 - 2015







Robbery (2015)



- Robberies increased from 37 in 2014 to 41 in 2015.

Aggravated Assault (2015)


- **Aggravated Assaults have decreased from 54 in 2014 to 29 in 2015**

Burglary (2015)


- **Burglaries decreased from 220 in 2014 to 206 in 2015**

- **Shoplifting accounts for 40% of the thefts.**




BMV (2015)





of Priority P Calls: 2011 – 82 2012 – 86 2013 – 81 2014 – 73 2015 – 102


Definition: The Graph portrays the time it takes a police officer to respond to a priority one call from when the telephone call is received by the telecommunications operator to the time the first officer arrives at the location. An emergency call is defined as a call in which there exists an imminent threat to life and/or potentially severe property loss. The Patrol Division's goal is to have an average response time to priority one calls of less than five (5) minutes.




Citation Violations

2011 - 2015



Injury Collisions


2011 – 2015
