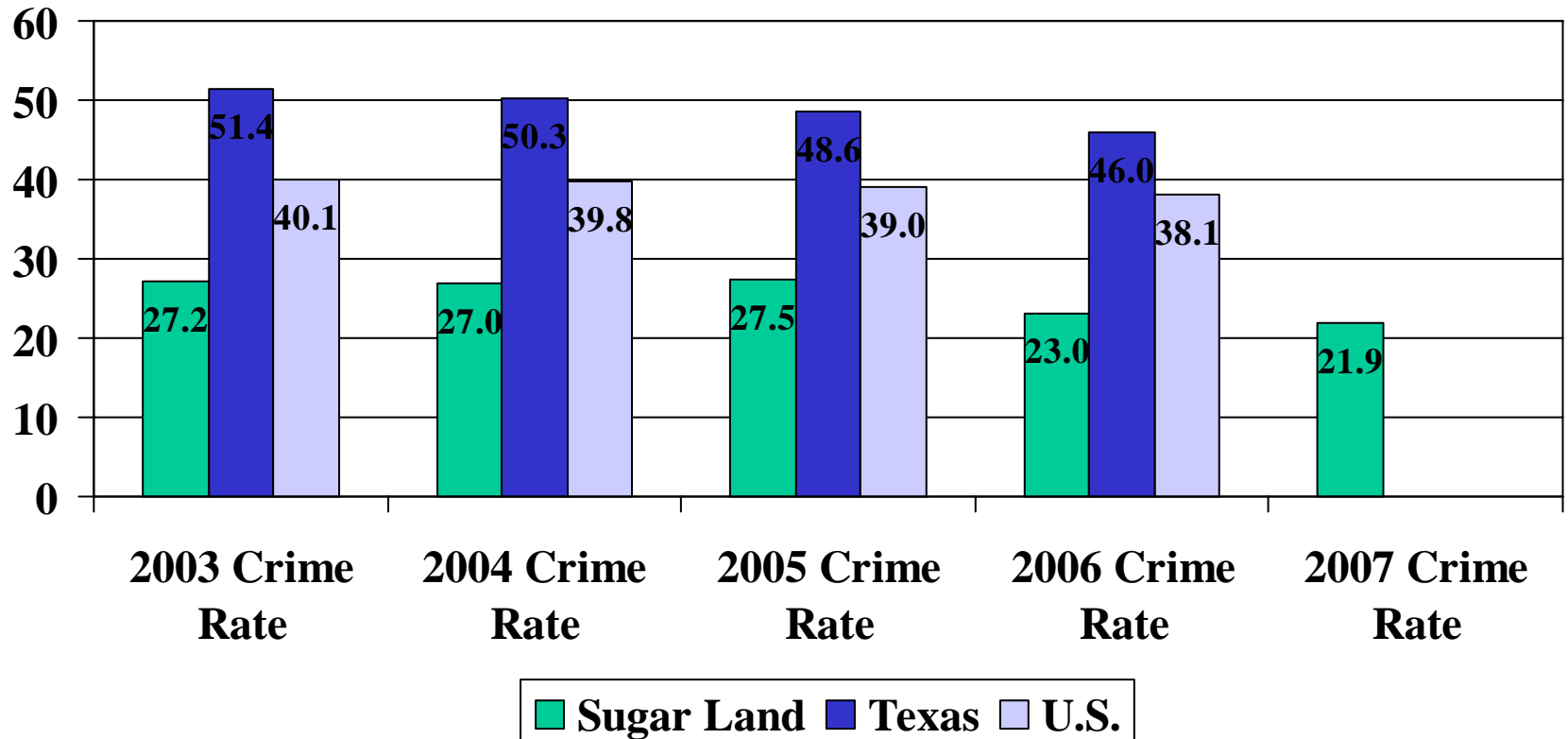

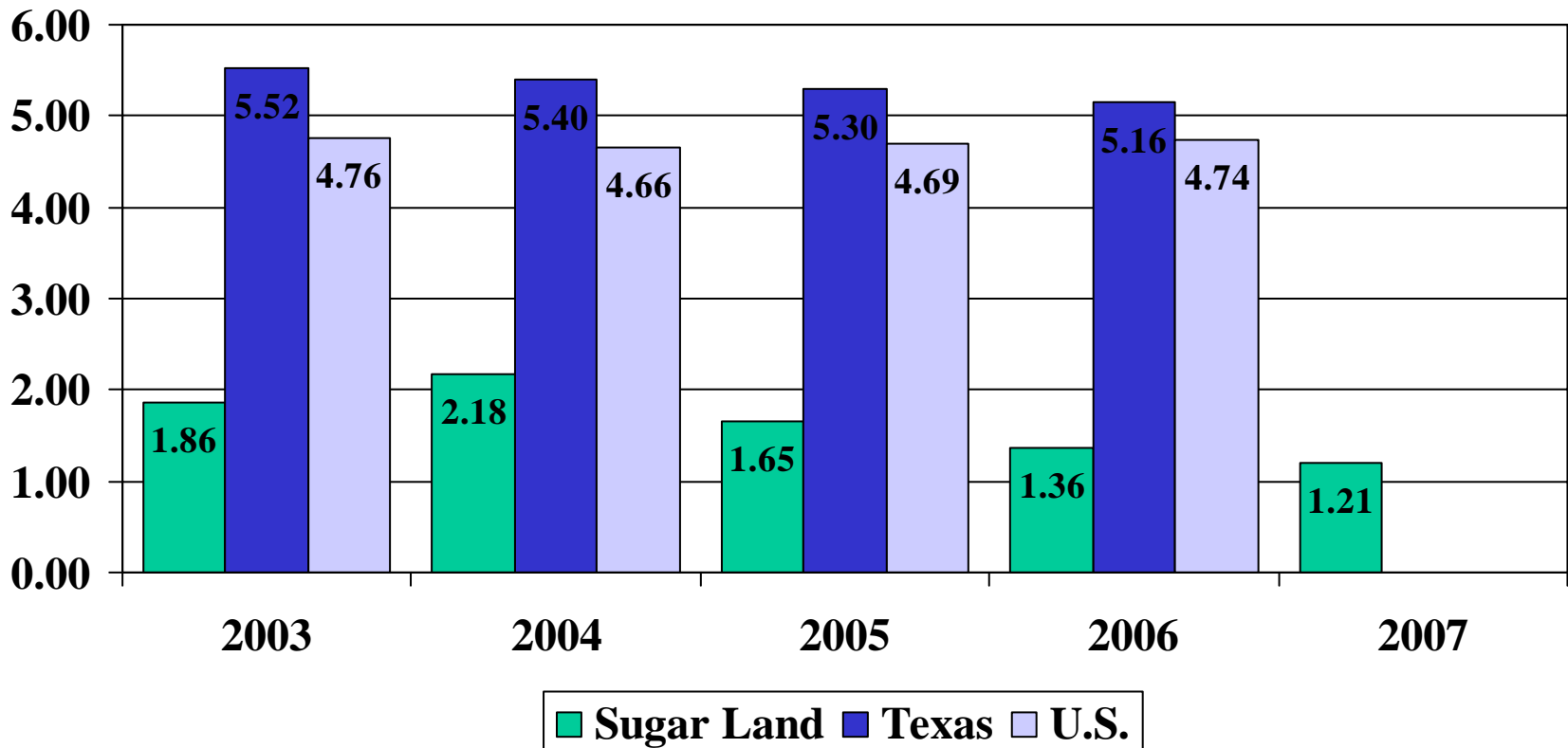

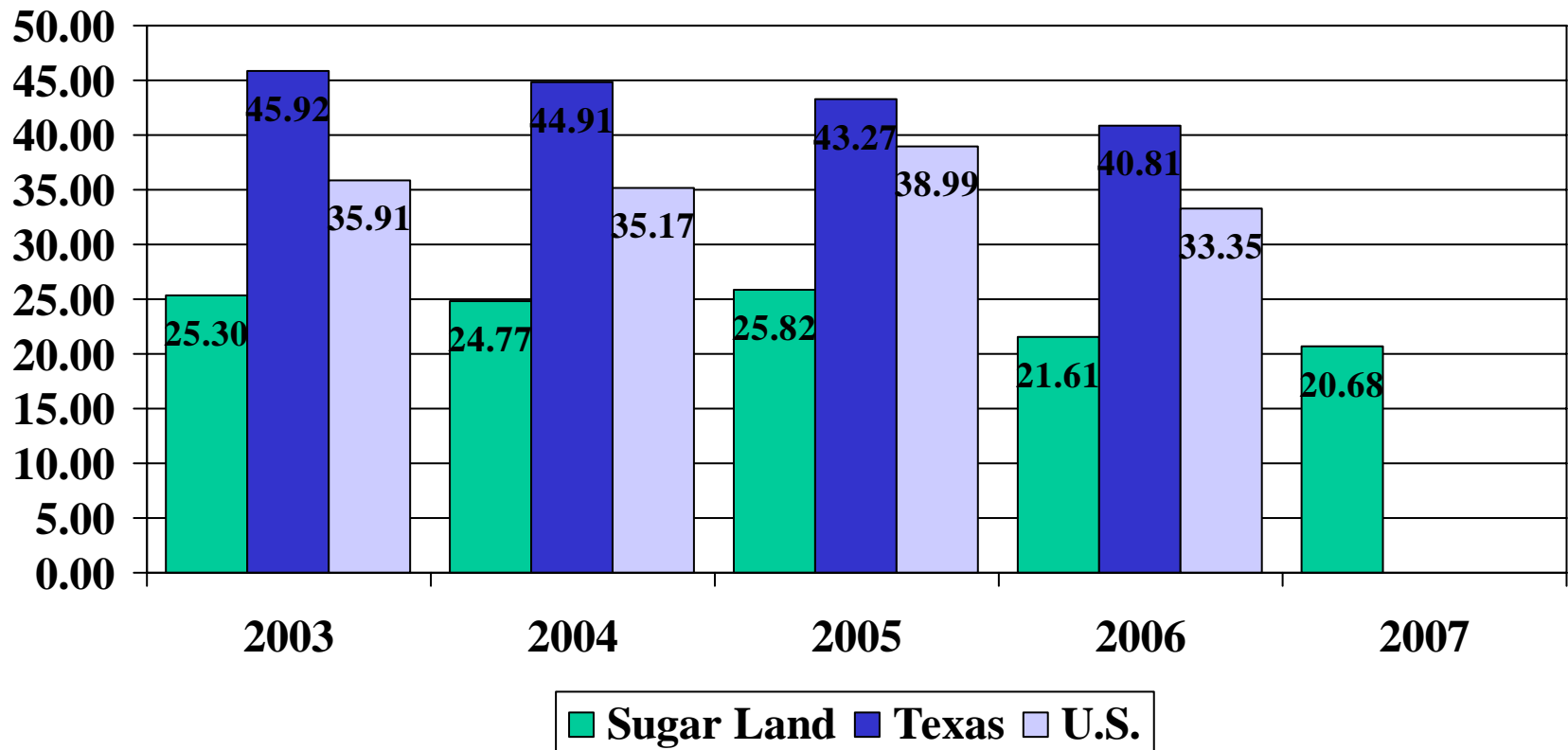
# Violent Crime Rate 2003 - 2007

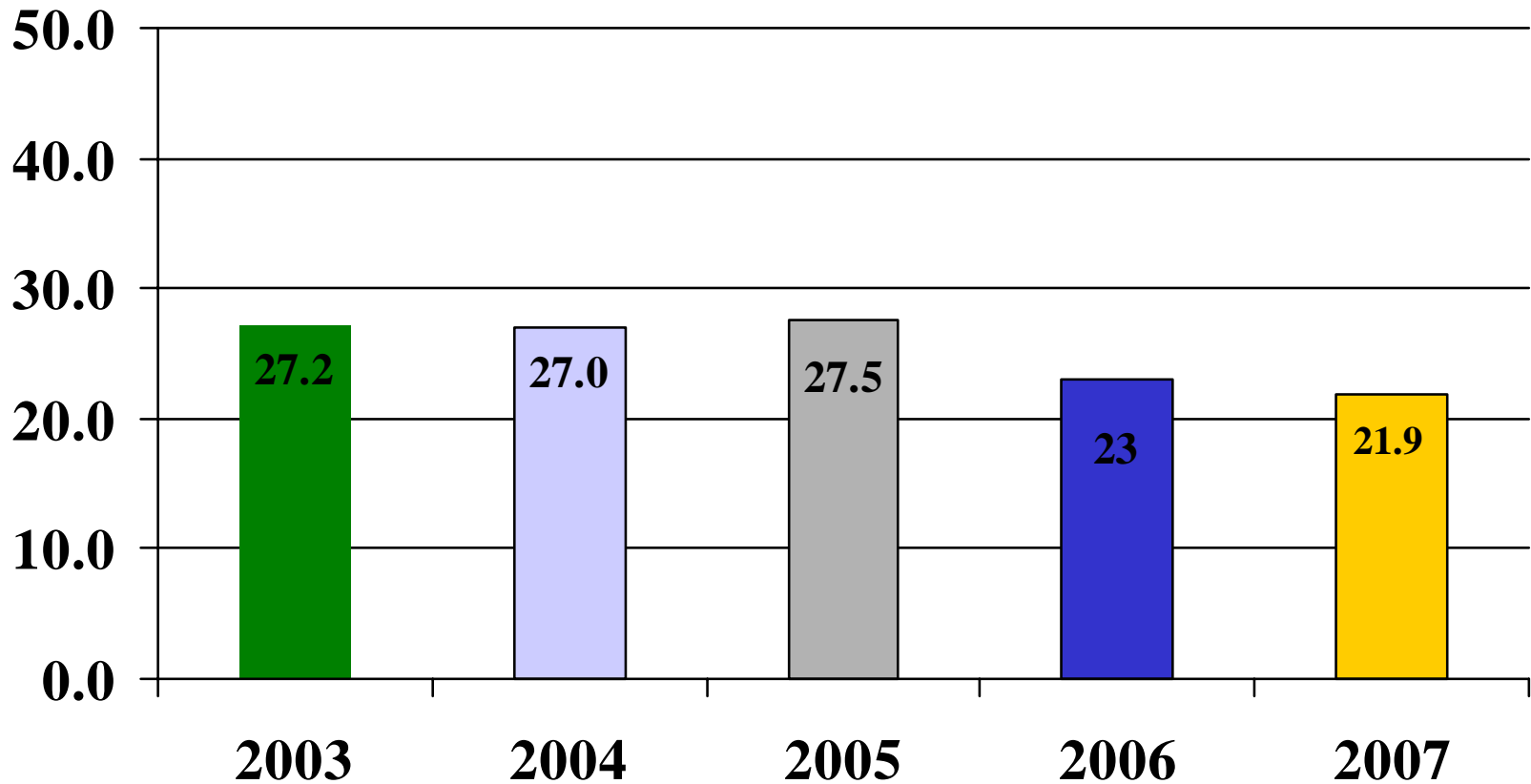
# Property Crime Rate 2003 - 2007

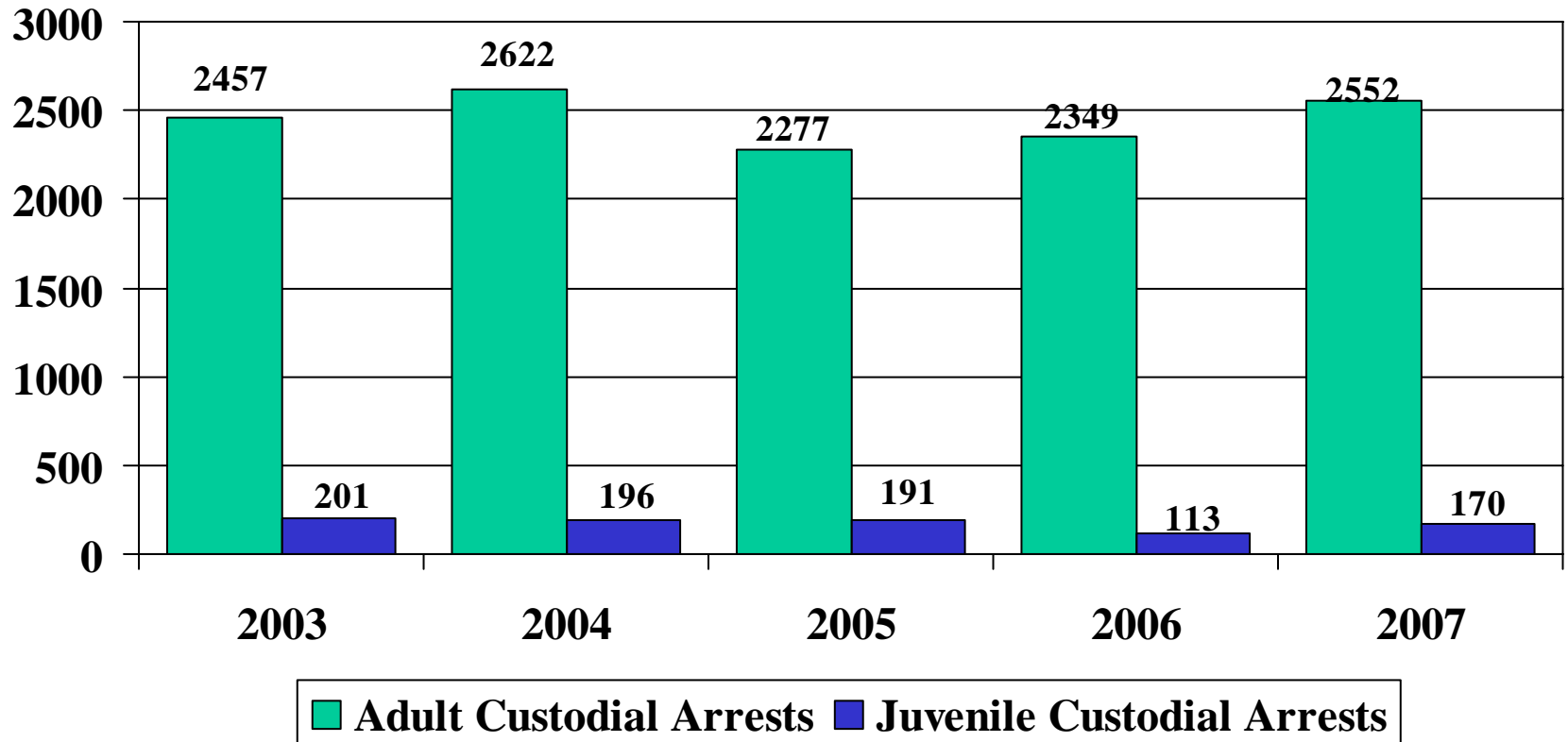

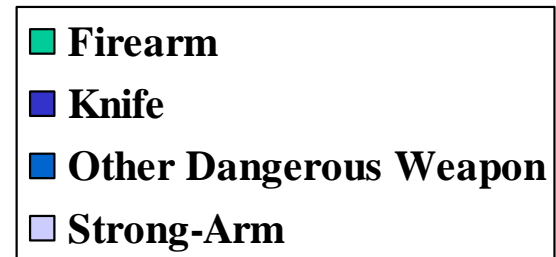
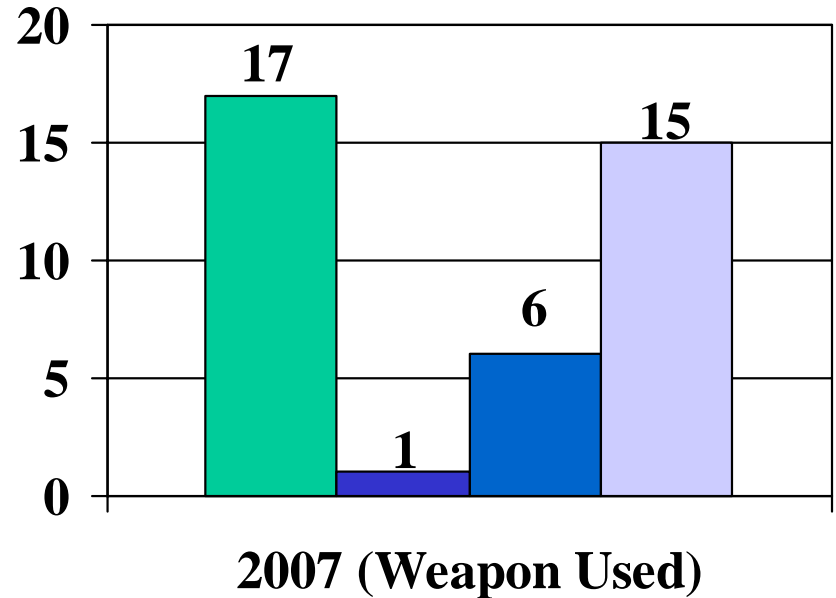


# Custodial Arrests 2003 - 2007



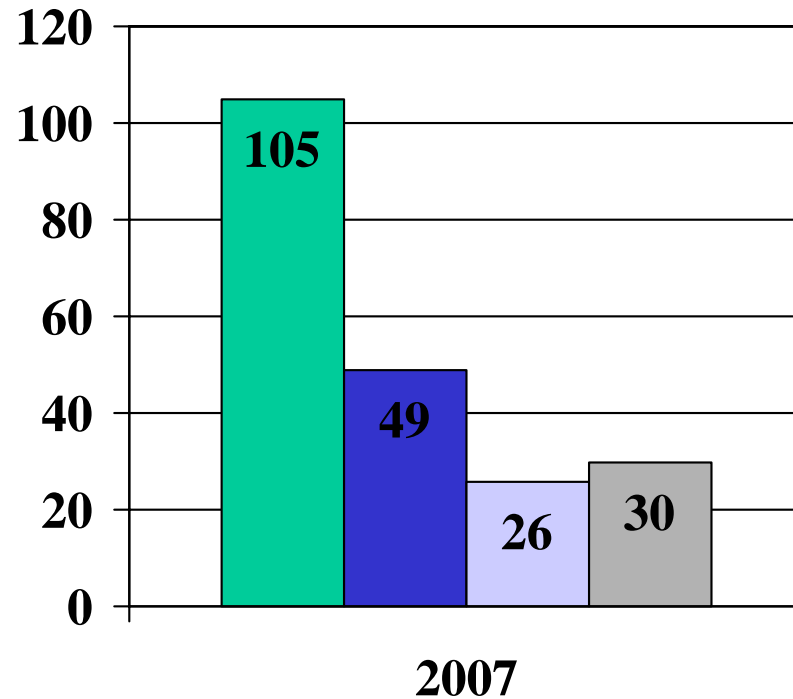
# Robbery (2007)

- Robberies down over 13% compared to last year.
- 15 of the 39 Robberies in 2007 occurred in residential areas.
- 2 robberies were shoplifting cases in which the suspect fought with loss prevention officers.
- 4 robberies were of purses or wallets in commercial area parking lots.
- 9 Driveway Robberies
- 6 Home Invasion Robberies
- 2 Bank Robberies



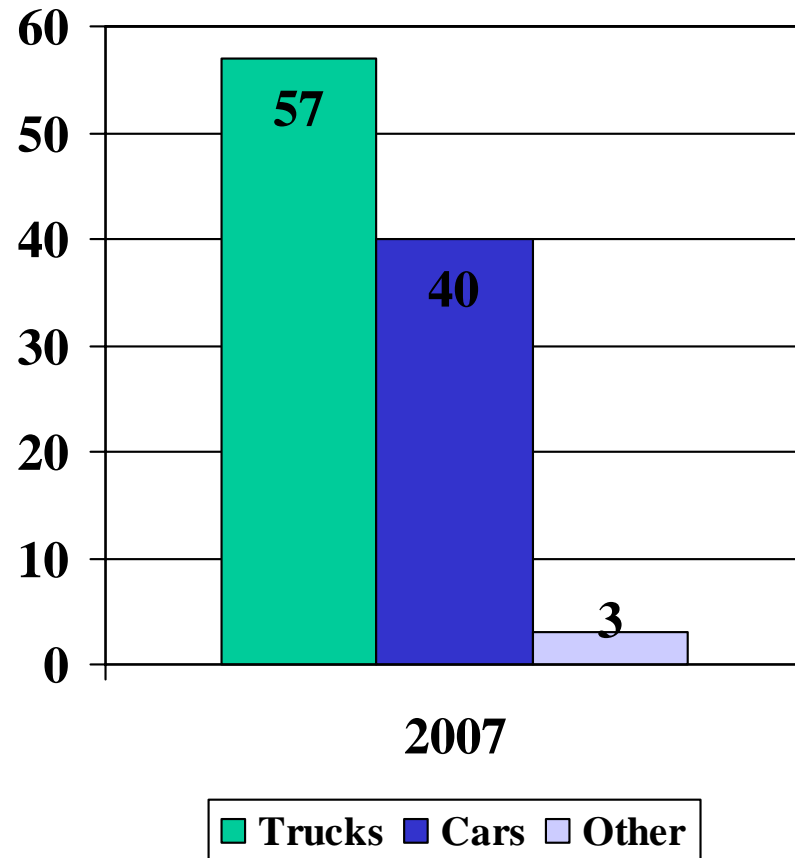
# Burglary (2007)

- 62% of burglaries were in residential areas, Nearly 20% of these were new home construction sites.
- 58% of all burglaries had no forced entry (doors unlocked).



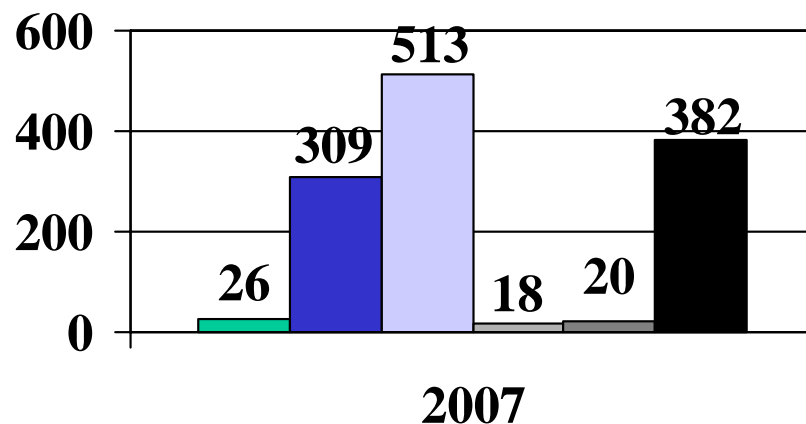
# Auto Theft (2007)

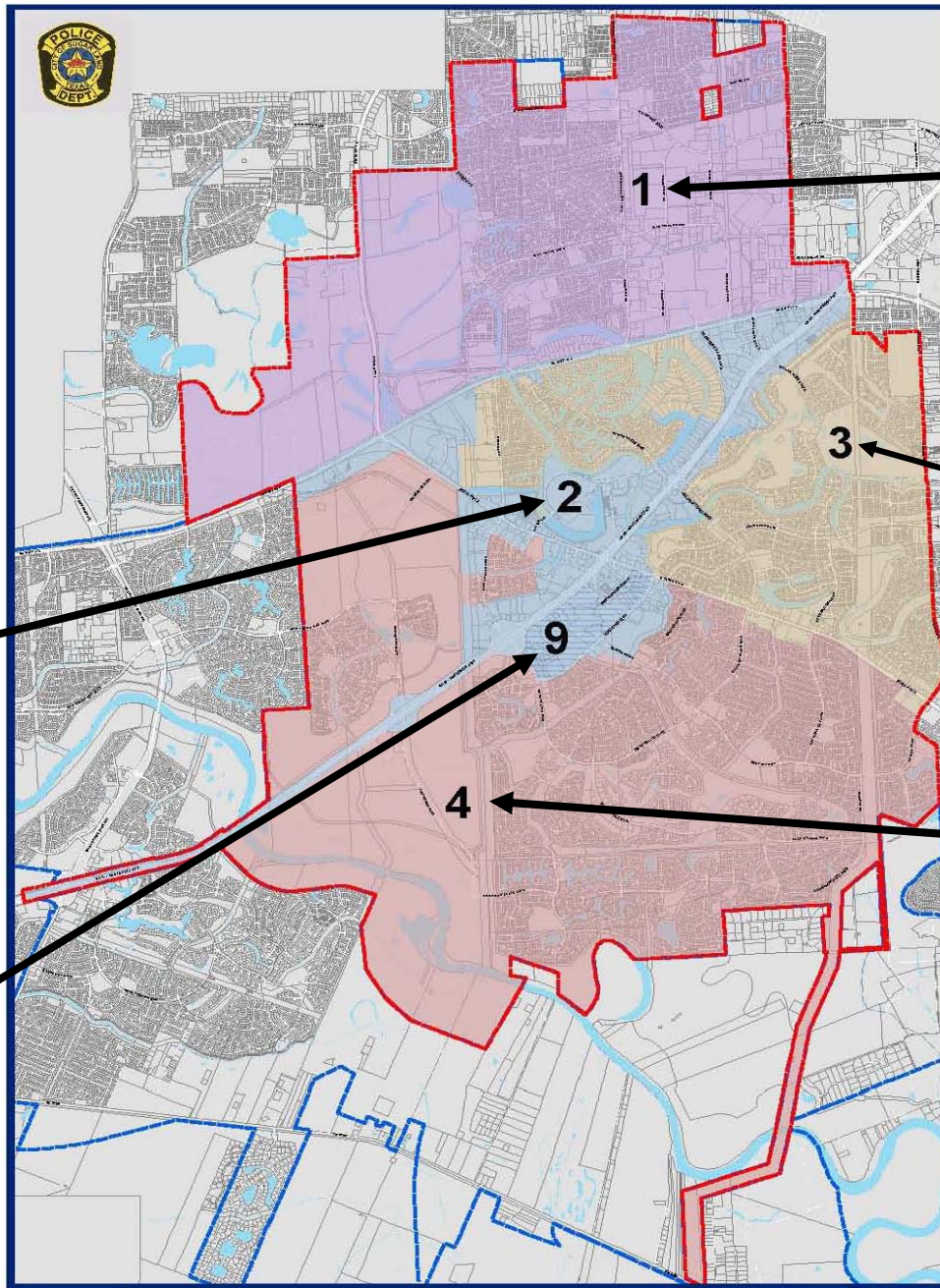

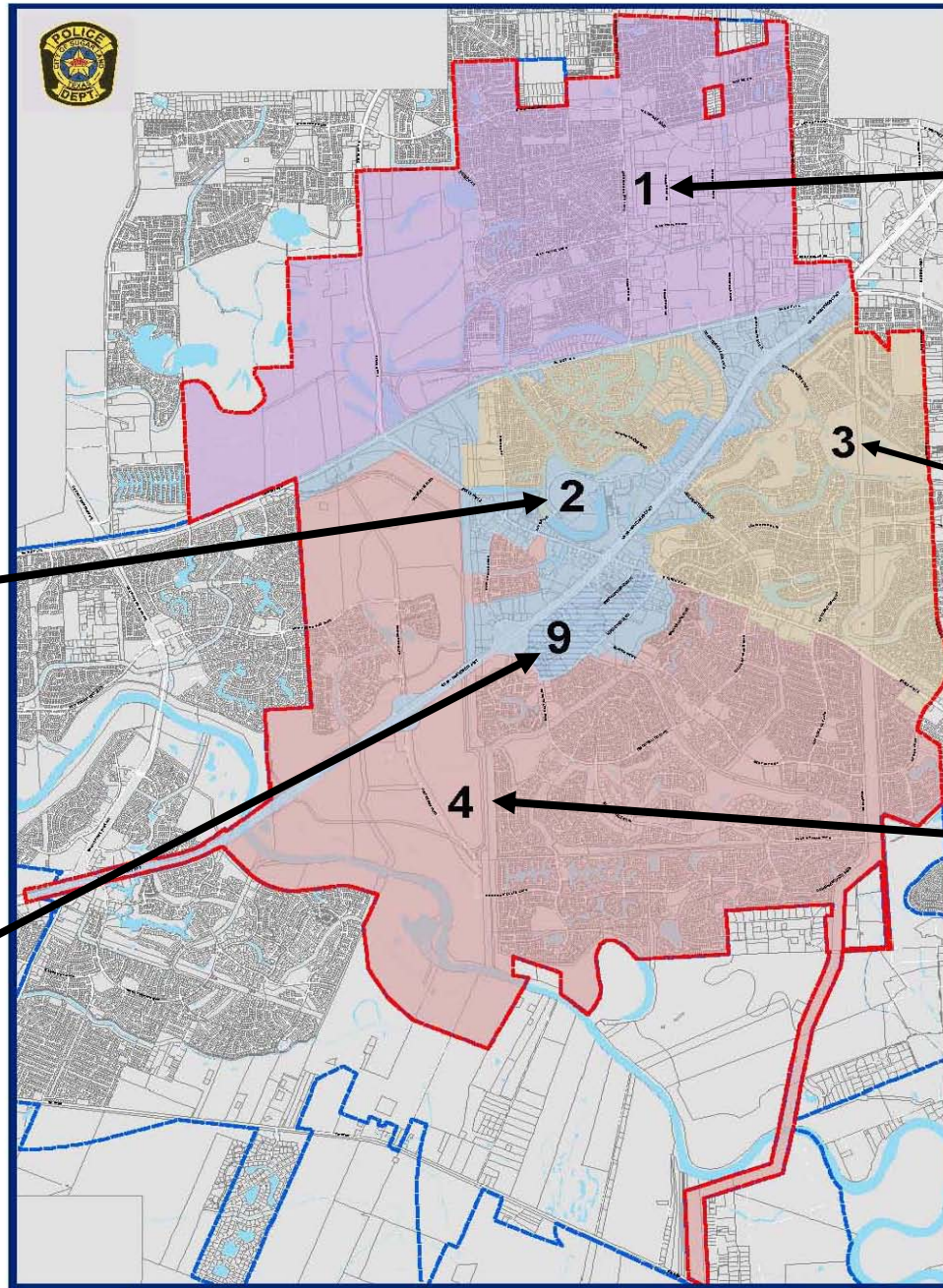

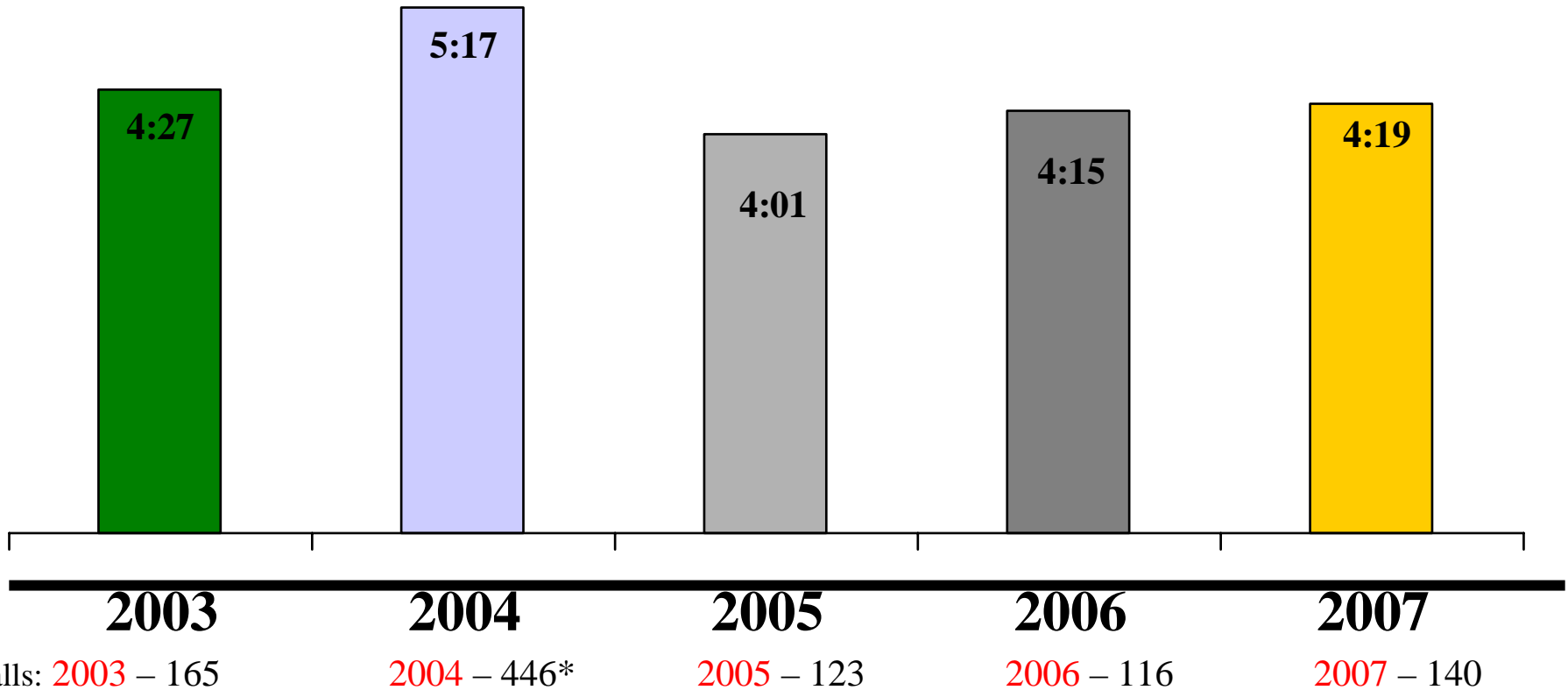

# *Police Response Time to Emergency Calls*

## Received to Arrival



**Definition:** The Graph portrays the time it takes a police officer to respond to a priority one call from when the telephone call is received by the telecommunications operator to the time the first officer arrives at the location. A emergency call is defined as a call in which there exists an imminent threat to life and/or potentially severe property loss. The Patrol Division's goal is to have an average response time to priority one calls of less than five (5) minutes.

\*In 2004 the types of calls in the priority were changed in the dispatch system, this was corrected in 2005.

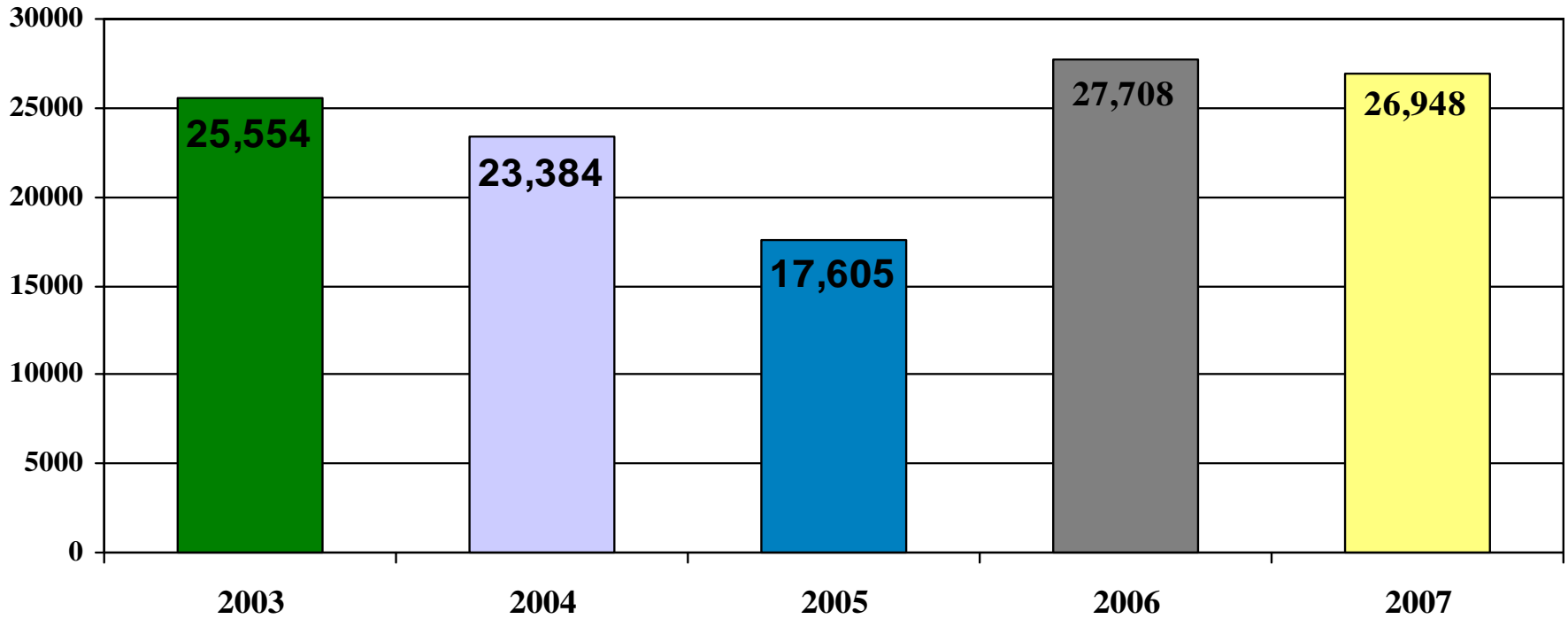

All Officers

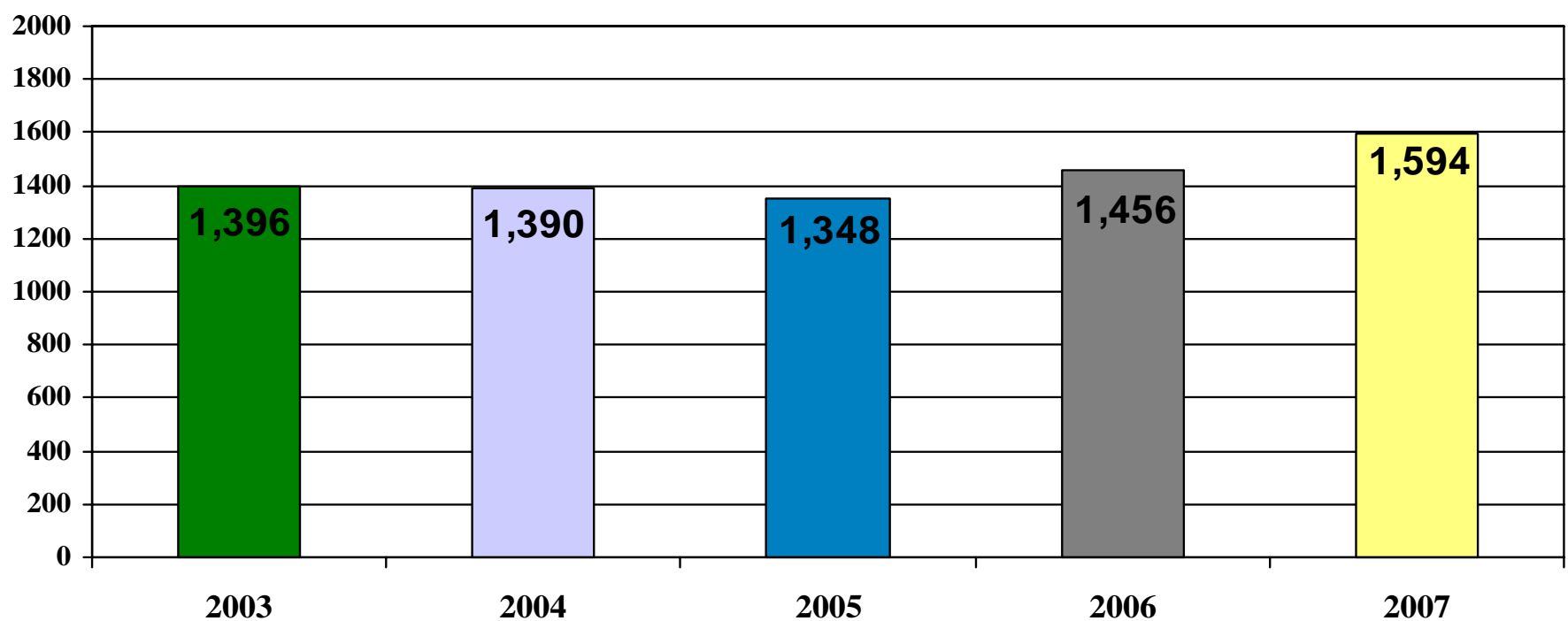

### 2003 - 2007



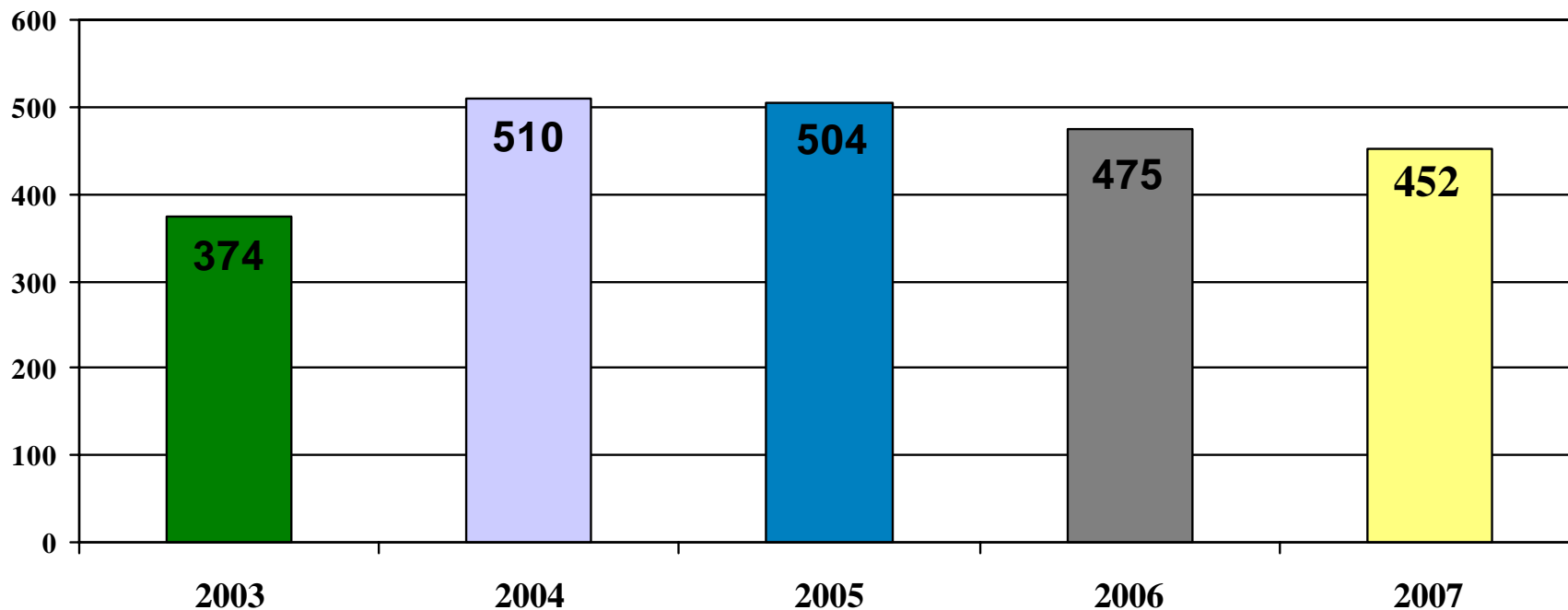

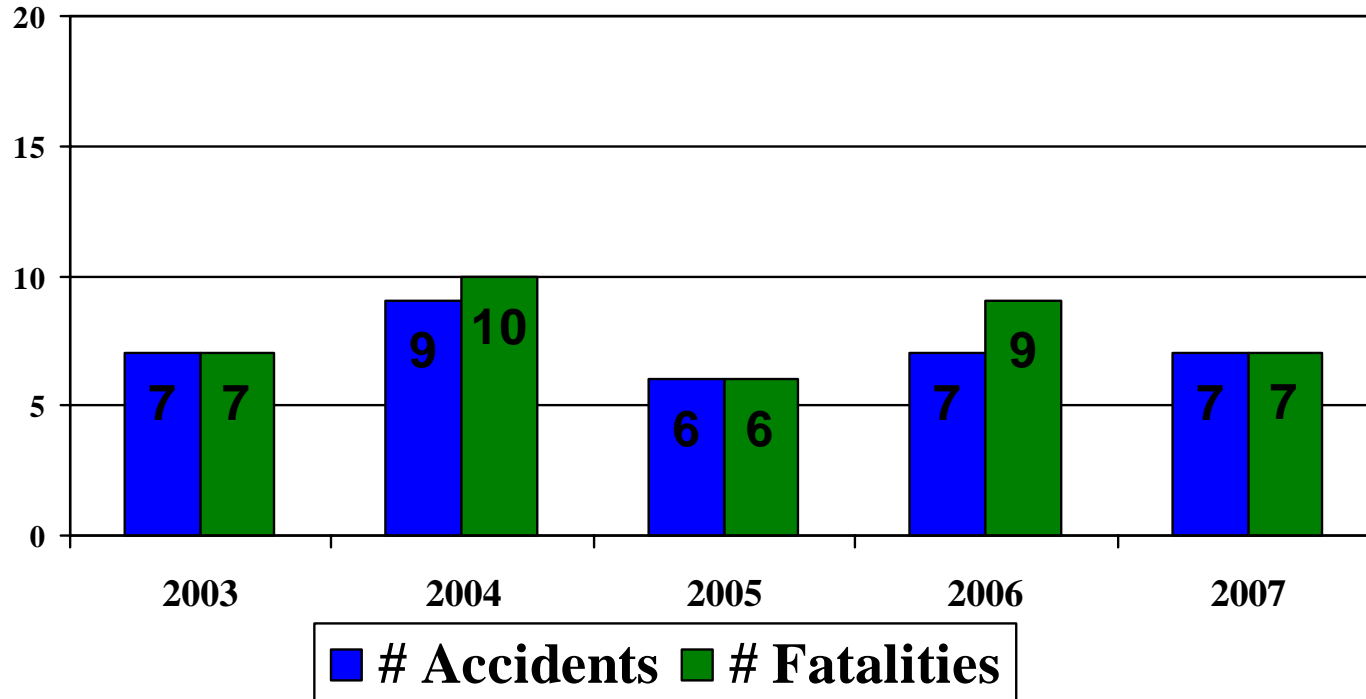
### 2003 - 2007

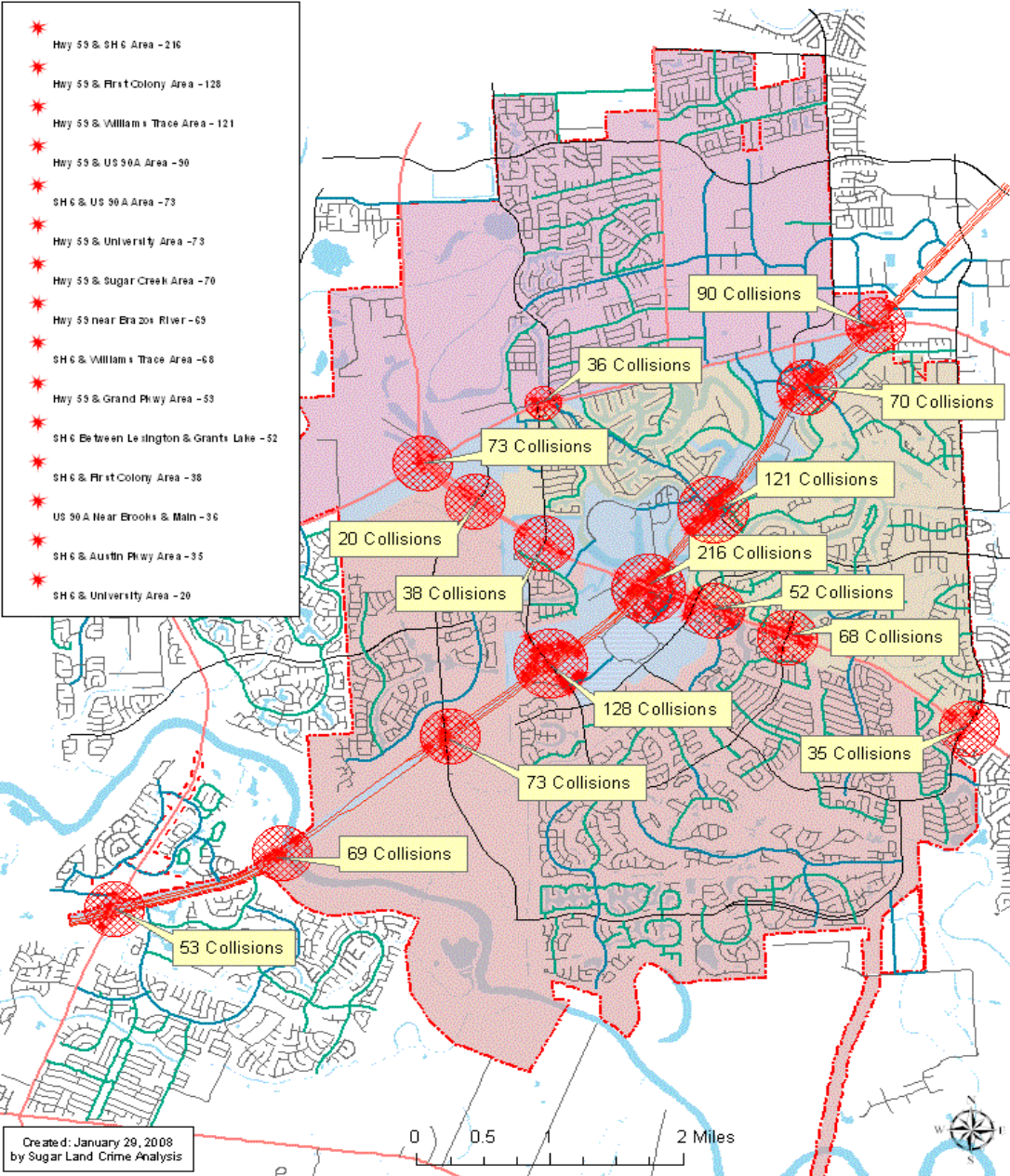

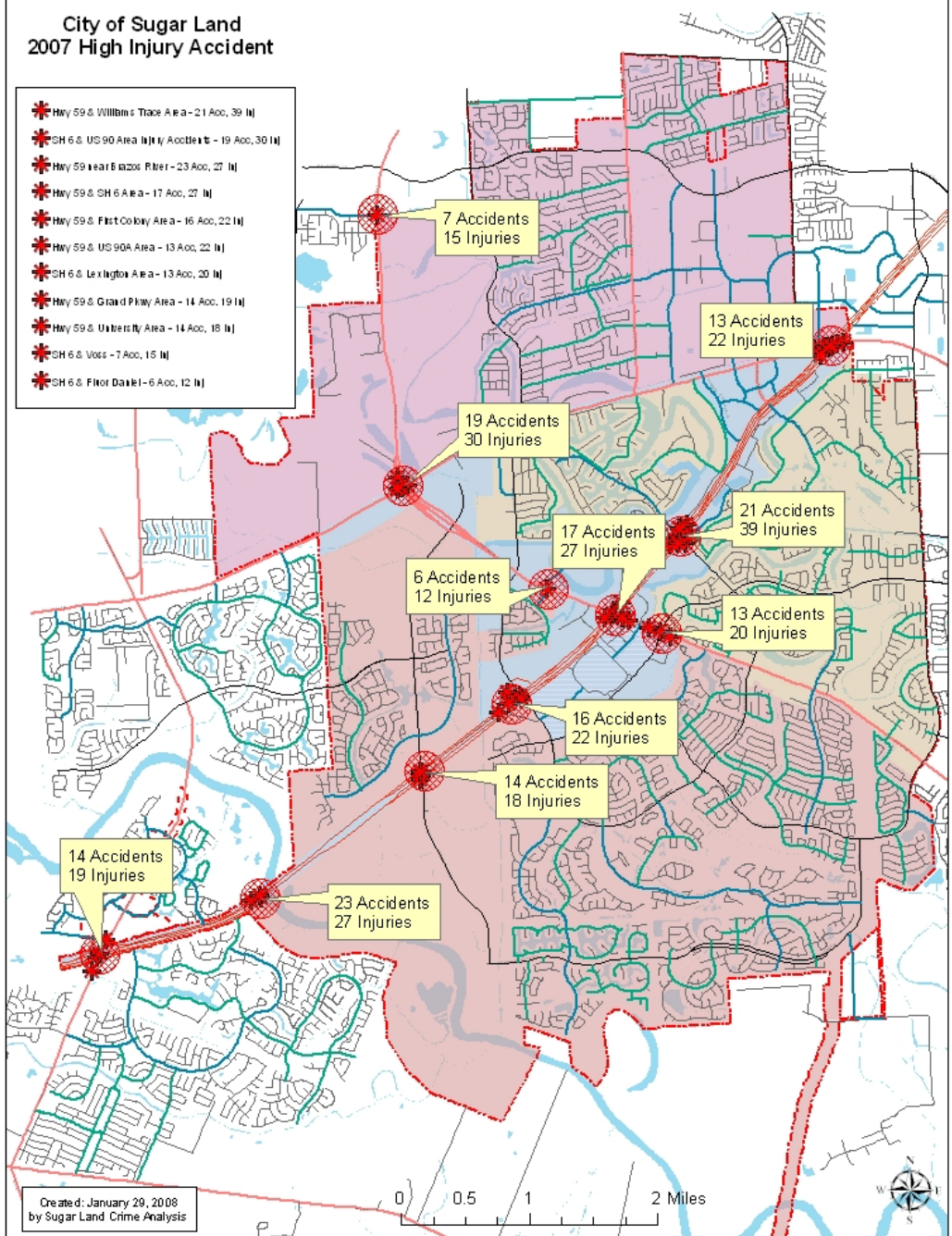

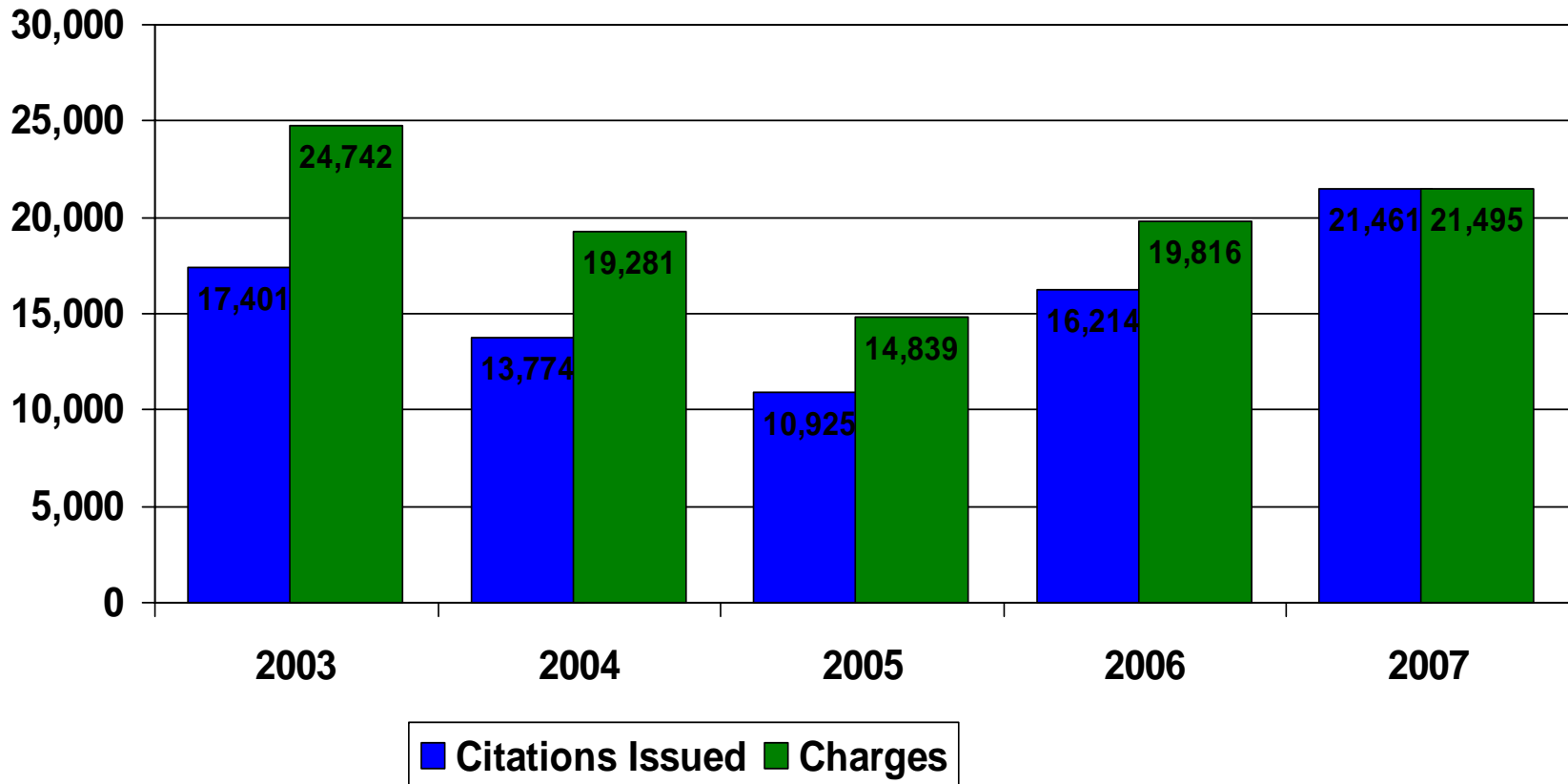

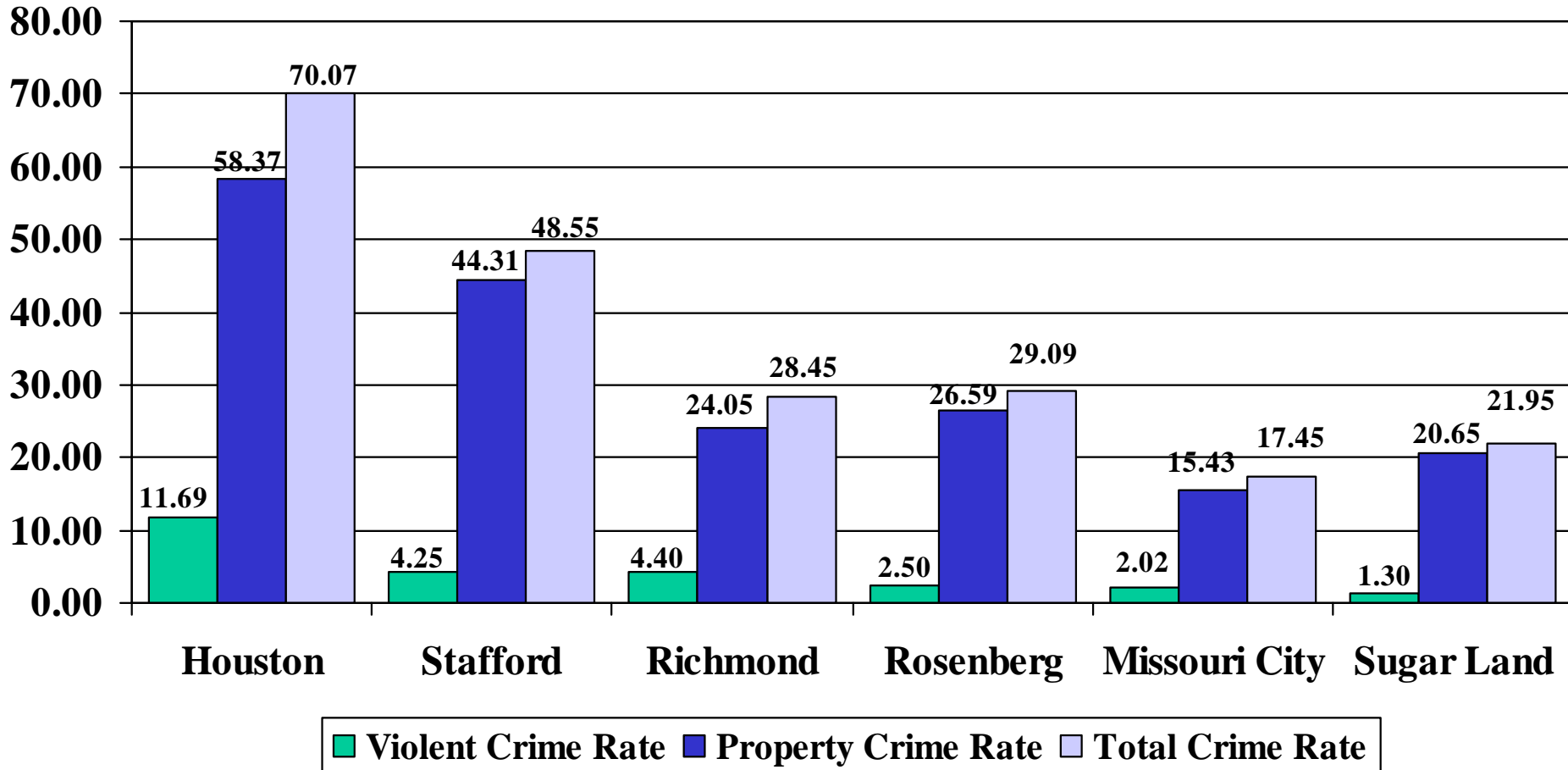

## 2006 Part 1 Crime Rate Comparison\*

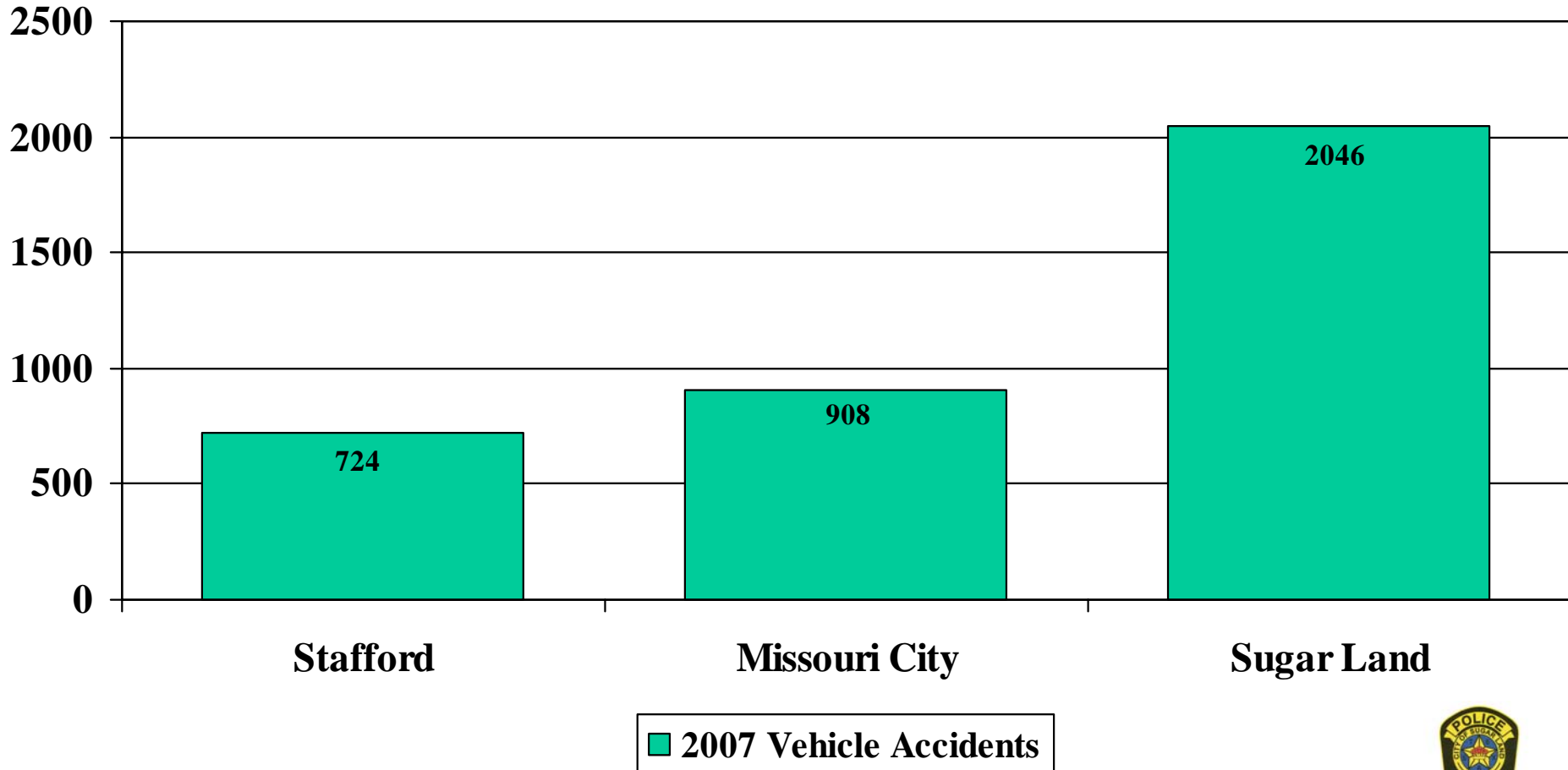

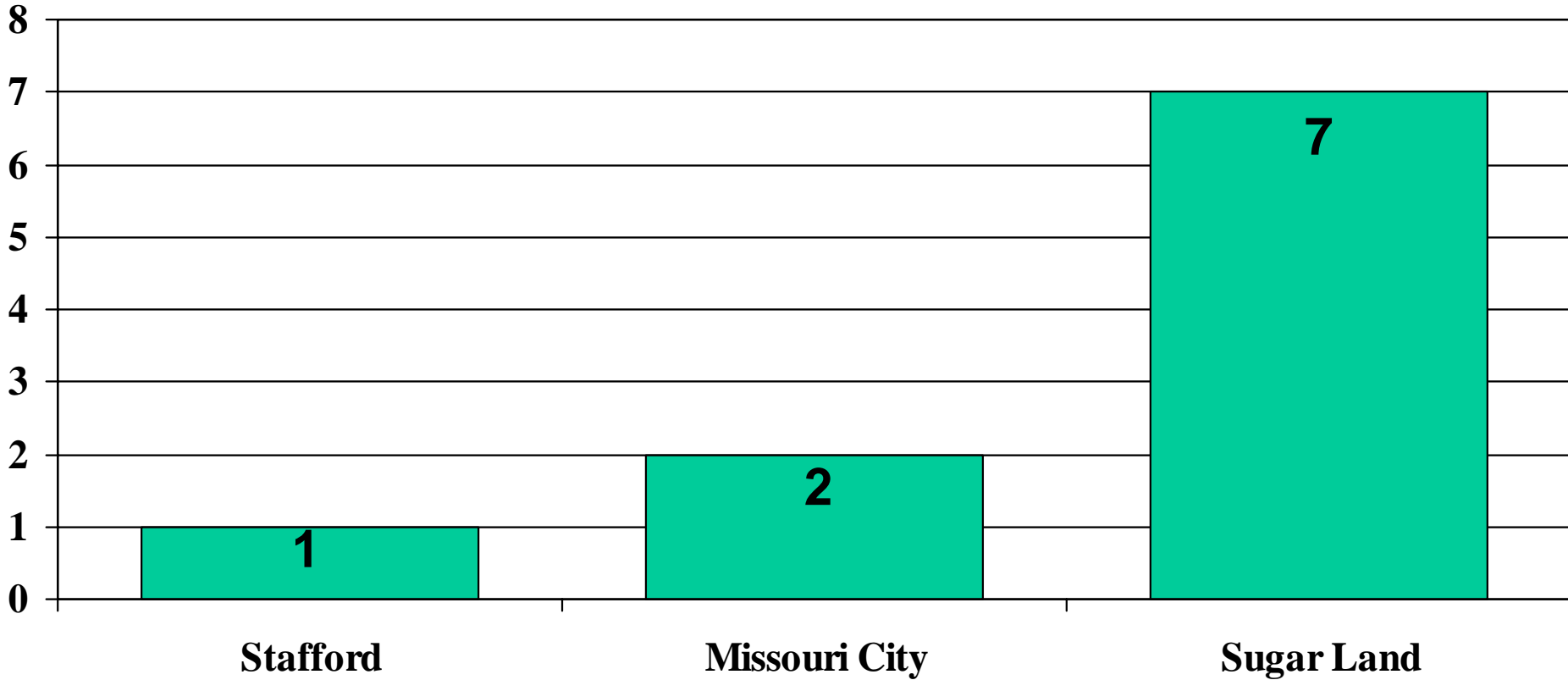

# *2007 Yearly Biased Based Profiling Report*

## General Order #01-11

*This report is given in order to comply with Senate Bill 1074, Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 2.132:*

### Requirements of Article. 2.132 subsection 6

(6) require collection of information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests resulting from those traffic stops, including information relating to:

- (A) the race or ethnicity of individual detained; and
- (B) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search; and
- (7) require the agency to submit to the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

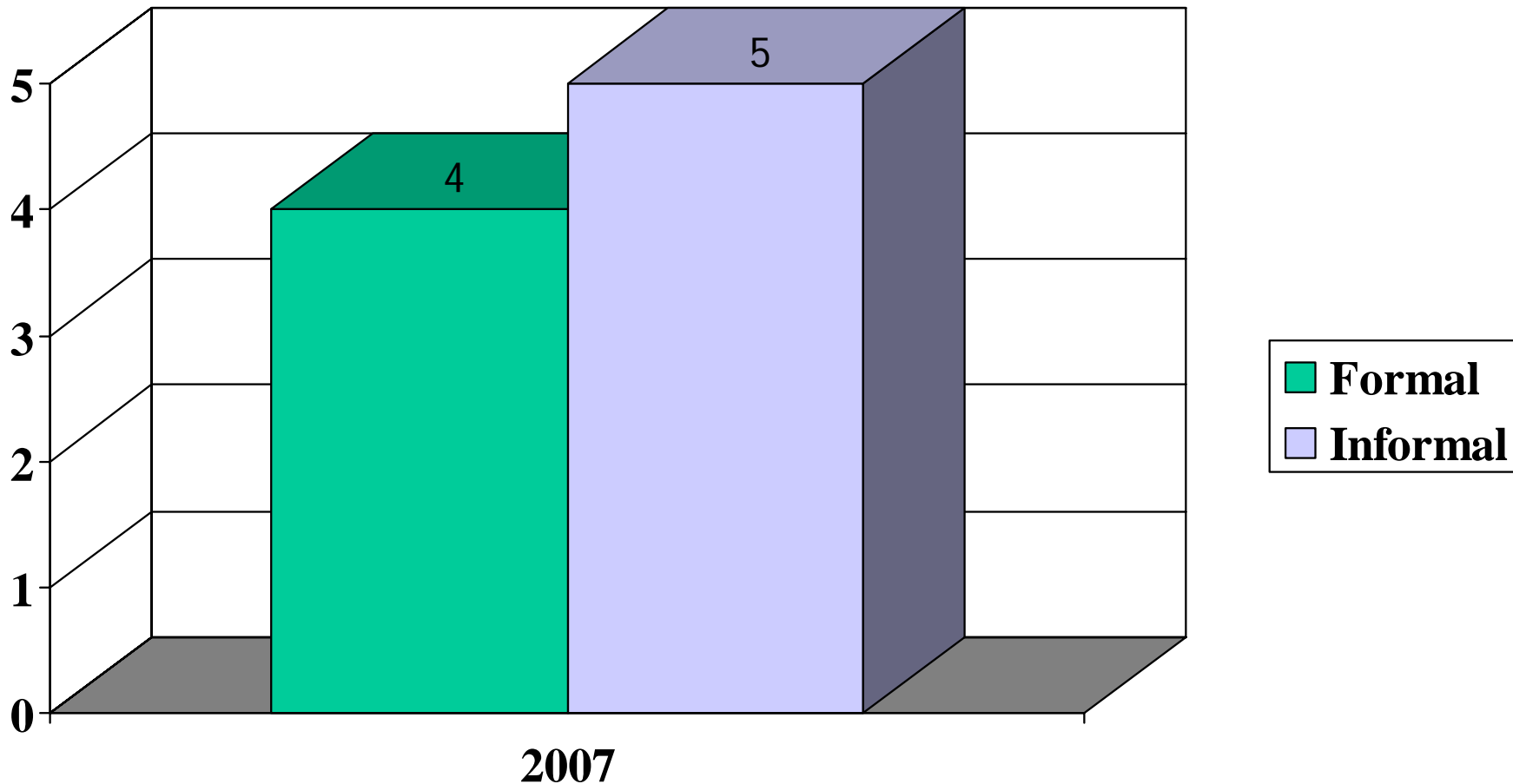

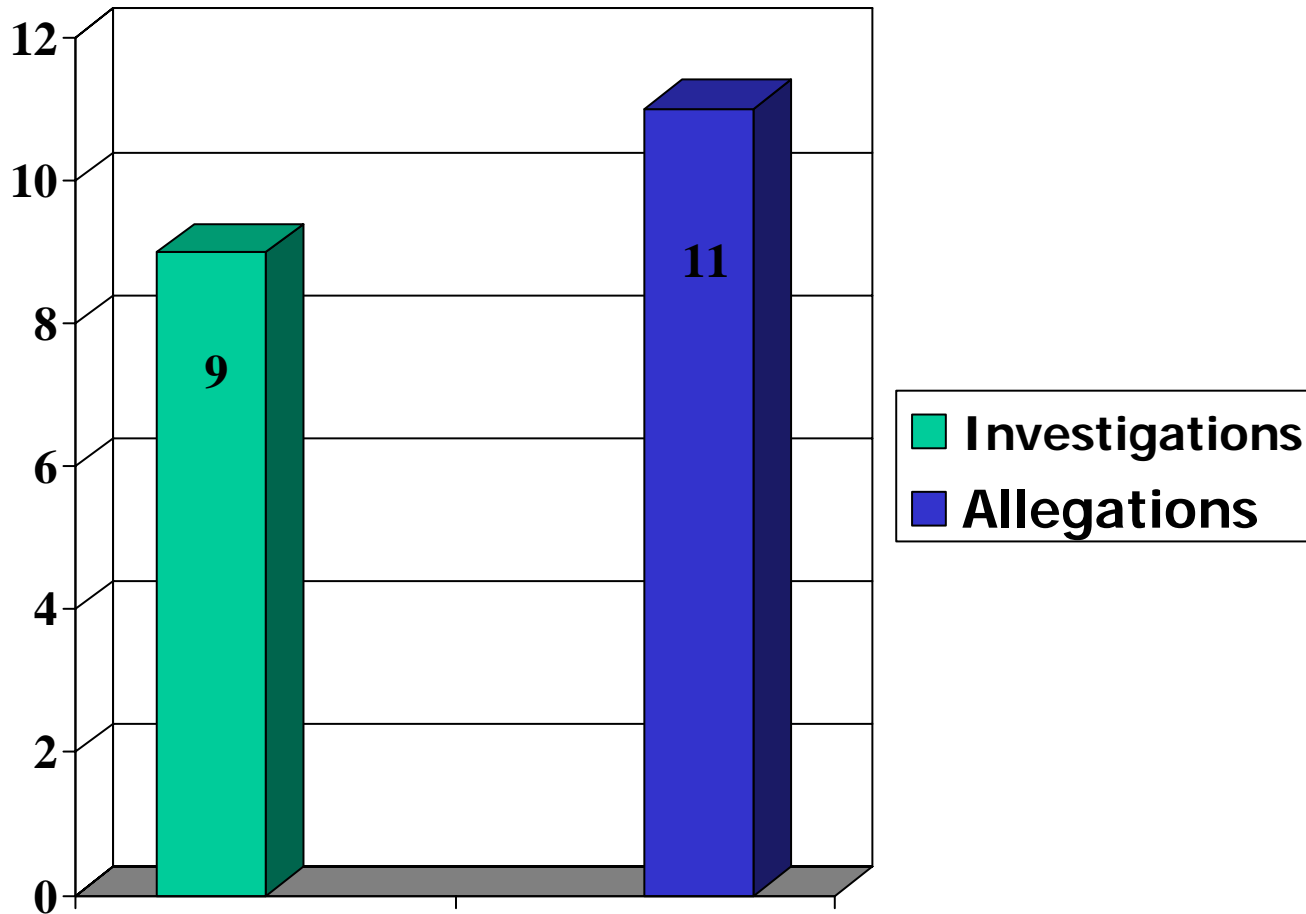
