Sugar Land Crime Rate




- The crime rate calculation is the number of crimes per 1,000 people within a jurisdiction.
- SLPD calculates violent and property offenses to determine the crime rate.
- The graph shows a consistent rate throughout 4 years. (2020 being low due to COVID).
- According to Forbes, Sugar Land was rated #10 in the Safest Cities in the US (with a population over 100,000).



Thefts

- **Our crime rate has increased due to the high number of thefts that have occurred in 2022.**
- **We have seen a 22.64% increase in thefts from 2021 to 2022.**



National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

- ▶ **National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is the FBI's crime tracking system, and Sugar Land Police Department (SLPD) reports crime in accordance with their program.**
- ▶ **Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, and Crimes Against Society.**


Theft from Motor Vehicle

- **We have seen a 26.31% increase in Thefts from Motor Vehicle (BMV) from 2021 to 2022.**
- **We had 49 juggings in the year 2022.**
- **Juggings are crimes of opportunity where a suspect watches the victim exit a bank, follows the victim to their next destination and ultimately takes money from the victim or from their vehicle.**



Auto Theft

- **Auto Theft has increased by about 28% from 2021 to 2022.**
- **The most stolen vehicles: 25 Chevrolet trucks, 10 Chevrolet SUVs, and 9 Ford Trucks.**



Burglary

- We are looking at a downward trend of commercial burglaries from 2021.
- There has been an uprise in residential burglaries (the most occurring at apartment complexes).
- We have seen a descending trend in residential burglaries after our second quarter of 2022.



Aggravated Assaults

- **There has been a 38.5% increase in Aggravated Assaults from 2021 to 2022.**
- **Approximately 10 of these assaults have been road-rage contributing to the increase of percentages**



Clearance Rate


- **Clearance Rate is a UCR calculation, using homicide, sexual assault, all assaults, robbery, burglary, theft, auto theft, and arson. A crime can be cleared by arrest or exceptional clearance, where the offender is identified, but prosecution declined-for ex: The offender has died, or the victim refuses to prosecute.**

2022	54.60%	16.0%




Calls For Services

- **Sugar Land responded to 70,931 calls for services in 2022. This is a 4% decrease from the 74,299 calls in 2021.**
- **The graph to the right shows the top 10 locations of calls for services within Sugar Land.**



Response Time

- ▶ **Response times are reported each quarter and collated by fiscal year. SLPD's goal is to respond to 80% of priority calls within seven minutes: One minute for dispatch and six minutes for police response.**
- ▶ **SLPD reached 84% for 2022.**


