



Custodial Arrests





- Family violence is up 12%



Frauds

- Face of fraud is changing—more business/unemployment fraud
- A legit company will never ask you to pay with gift cards (not even Apple cards for Apple)
- Be wary of charities asking for digital gift cards donations

Protect Yourself from Social Security Scams
Be on the lookout for fake calls and emails

Telephone and email scammers are pretending to be government employees. They may threaten you and may demand immediate payment to avoid arrest or other legal action. Do not be fooled!

If you receive a suspicious call:


1. **HANG UP**

What to look out for

 <p>The caller says there is a problem with your Social Security number or account.</p>	 <p>Scammers pretend they're from Social Security or another government agency. Caller ID or documents sent by email may look official but they are not.</p>
 <p>Any call asking you to pay a fine or debt with retail gift cards, wire transfers, pre-paid debit cards, internet currency, or by mailing cash.</p>	 <p>Callers threaten you with arrest or other legal action.</p>


Auto Thefts

- Auto theft was up 28% from 2019 to 2020
- Most stolen vehicles:
 - Chevy Truck - 14
 - Chevy SUV - 12
 - GMC SUV - 7

- Thefts were down 23% from 2019 to 2020
- Shoplifting was down 33%




Theft from Motor Vehicle (BMV)


- BMVs were down 7% from 2019 to 2020


2020 Calls by Beat




Top Call Locations




Police Response Time




