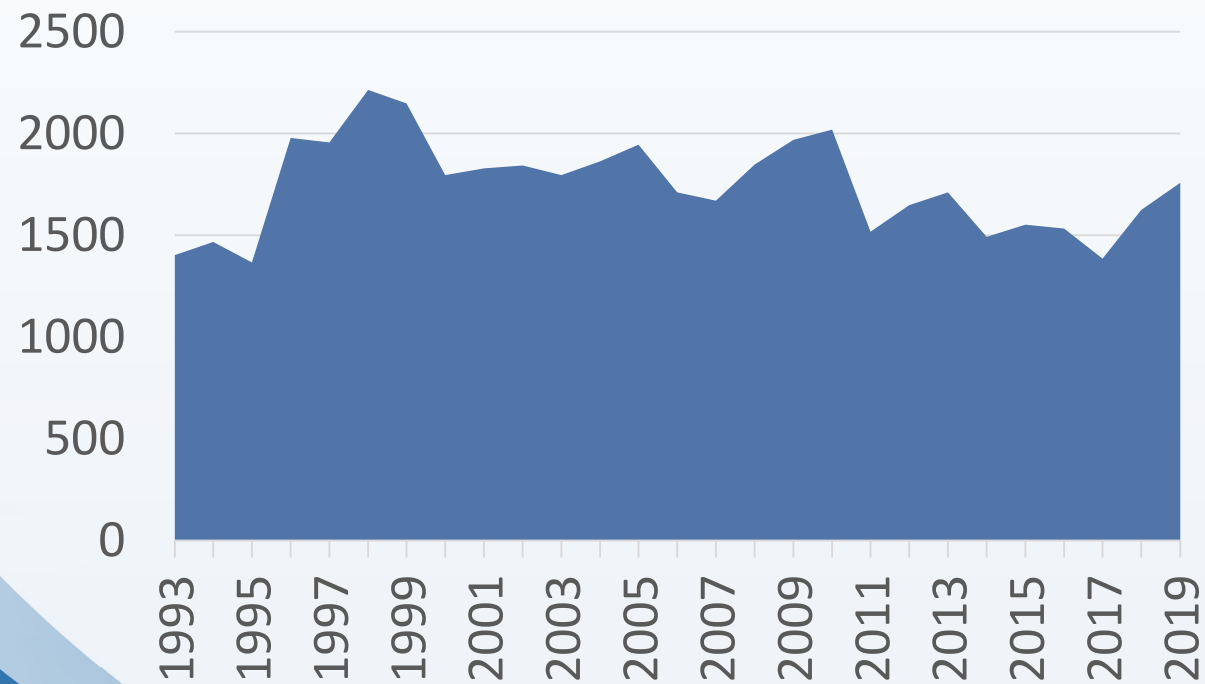

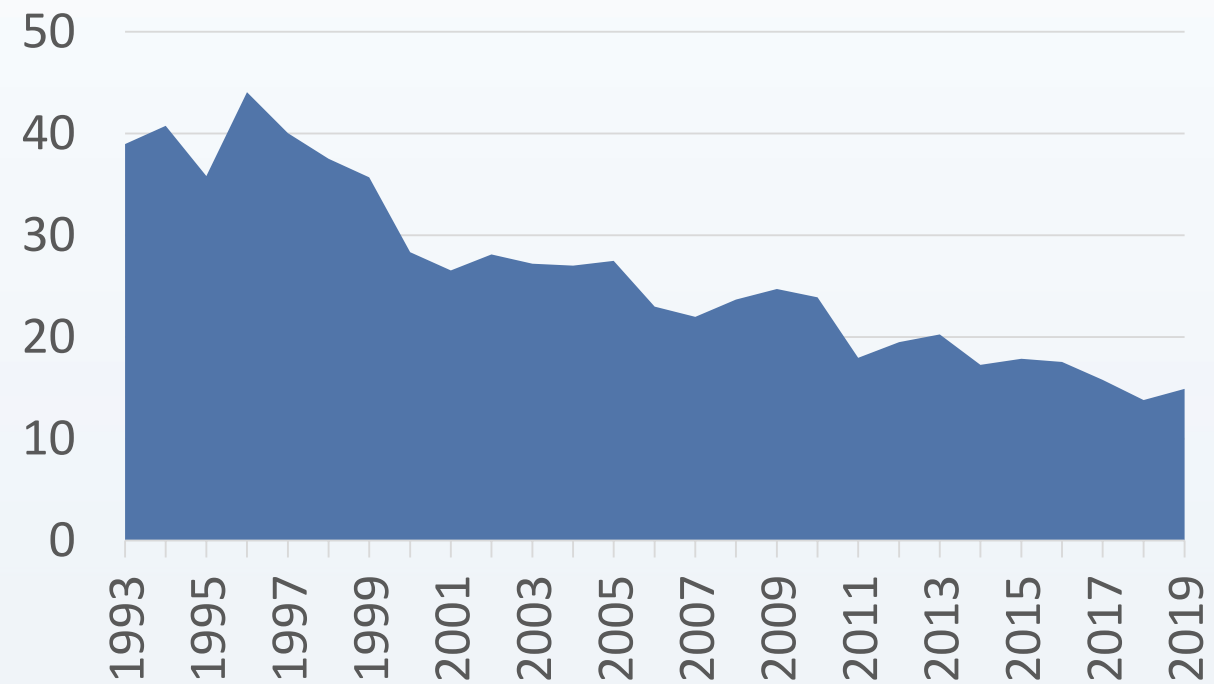
Sugar Land Part I Crime Rate

14.88 in 2019, 13.78 in 2018

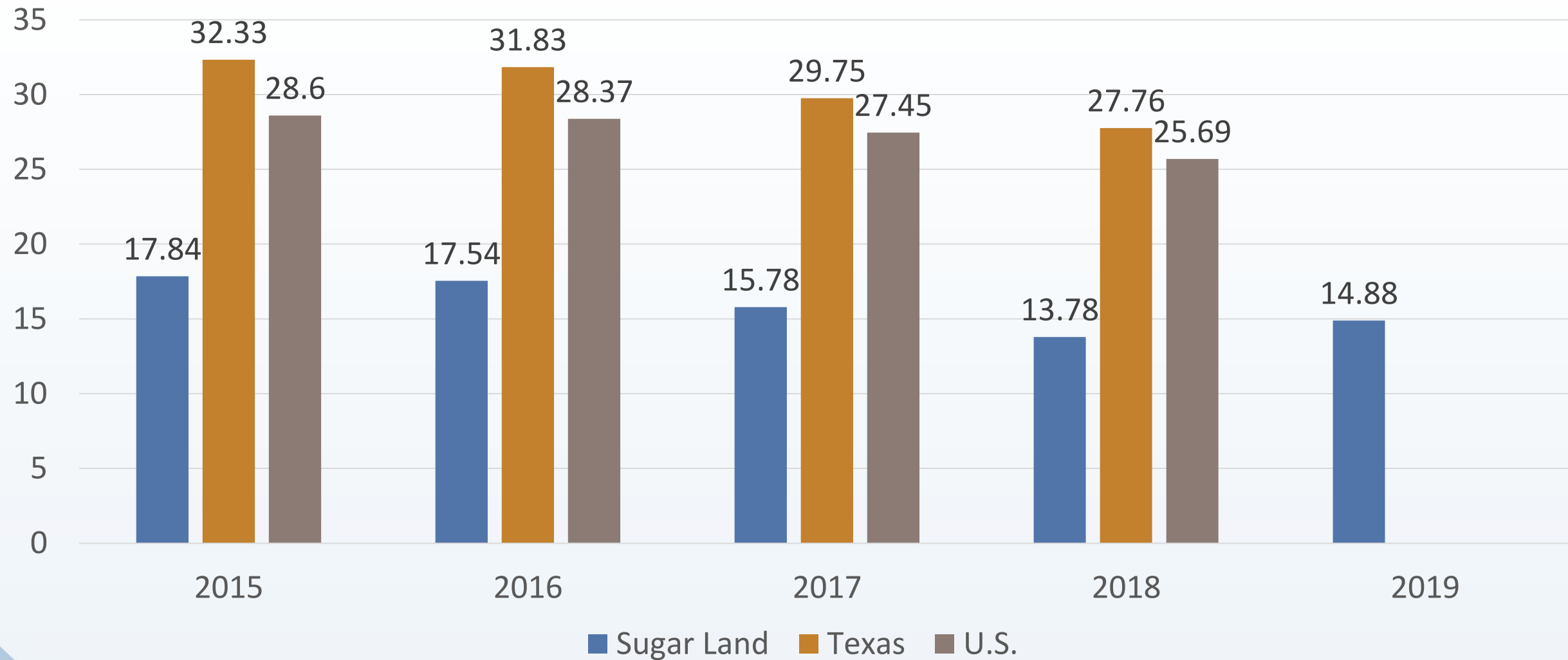

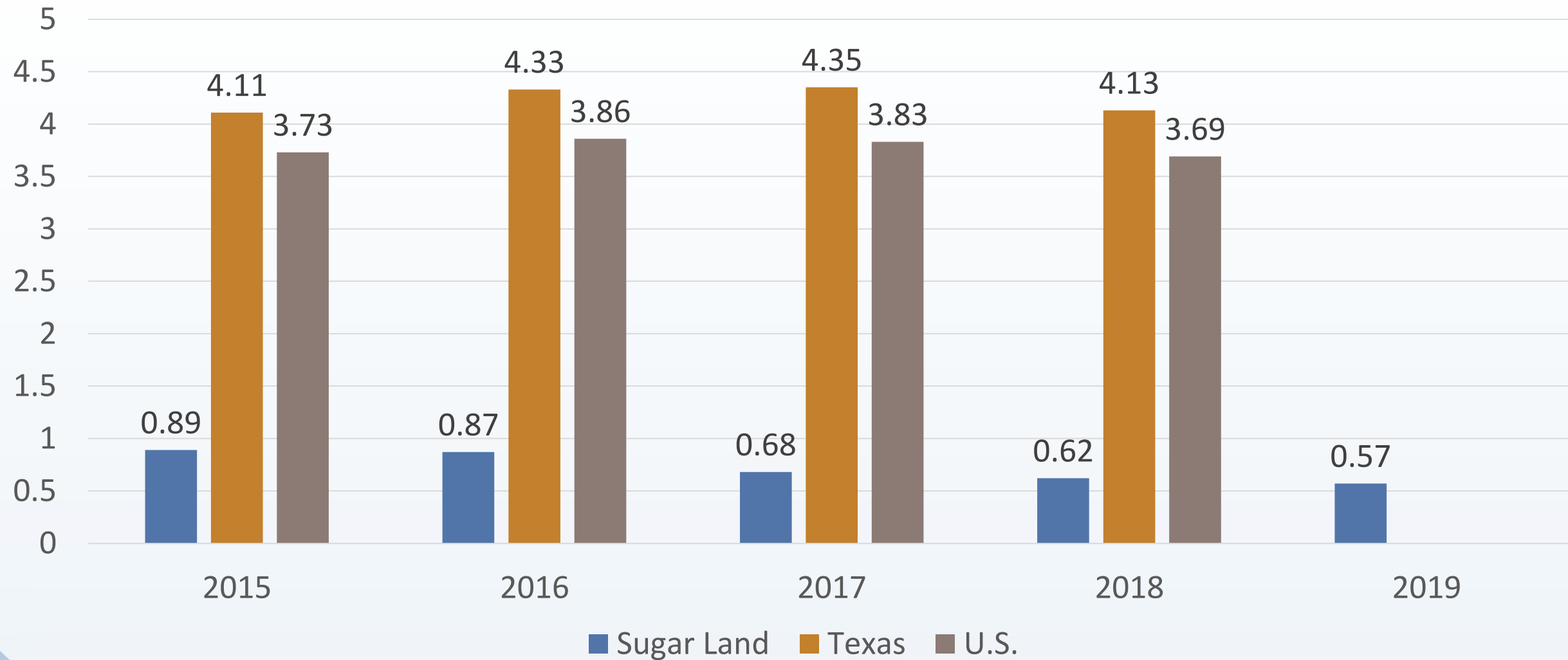


Part I Crime Rate 2015 – 2019



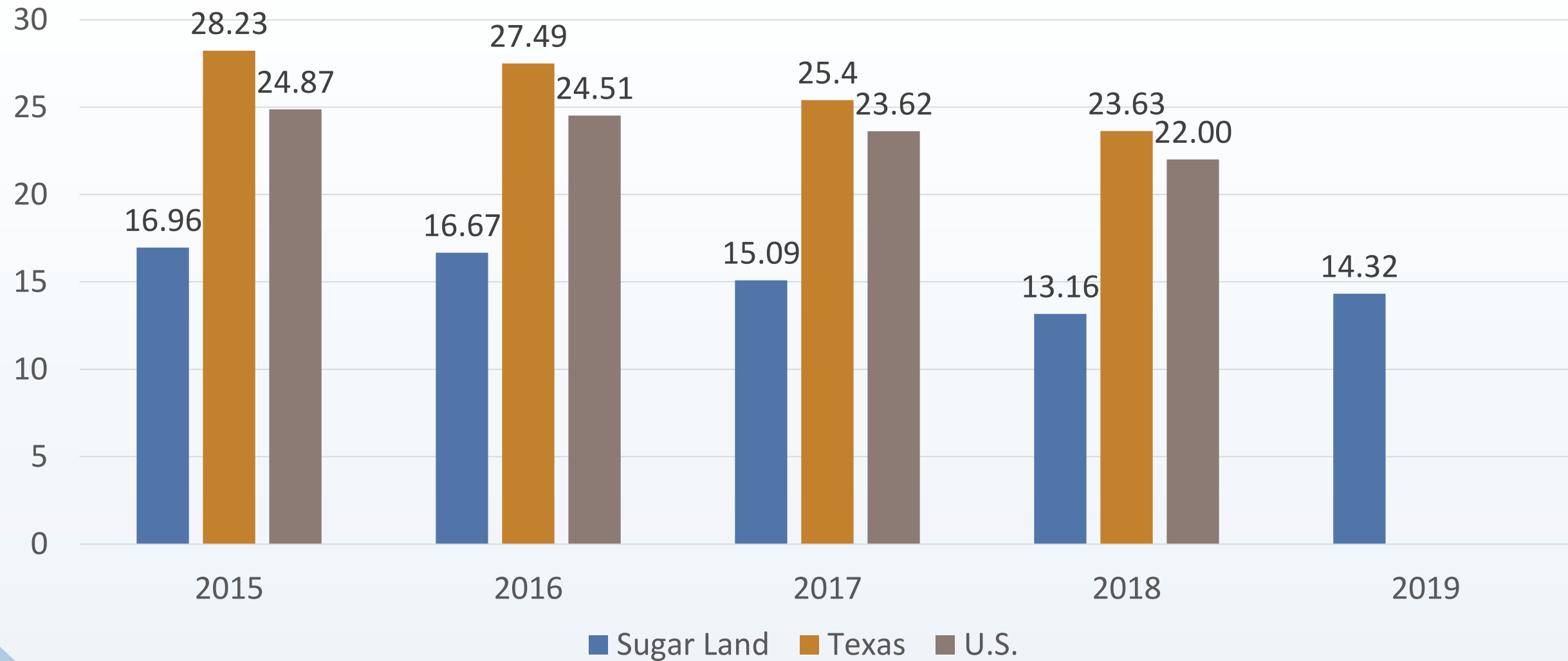

Violent Crime Rate 2015 – 2019



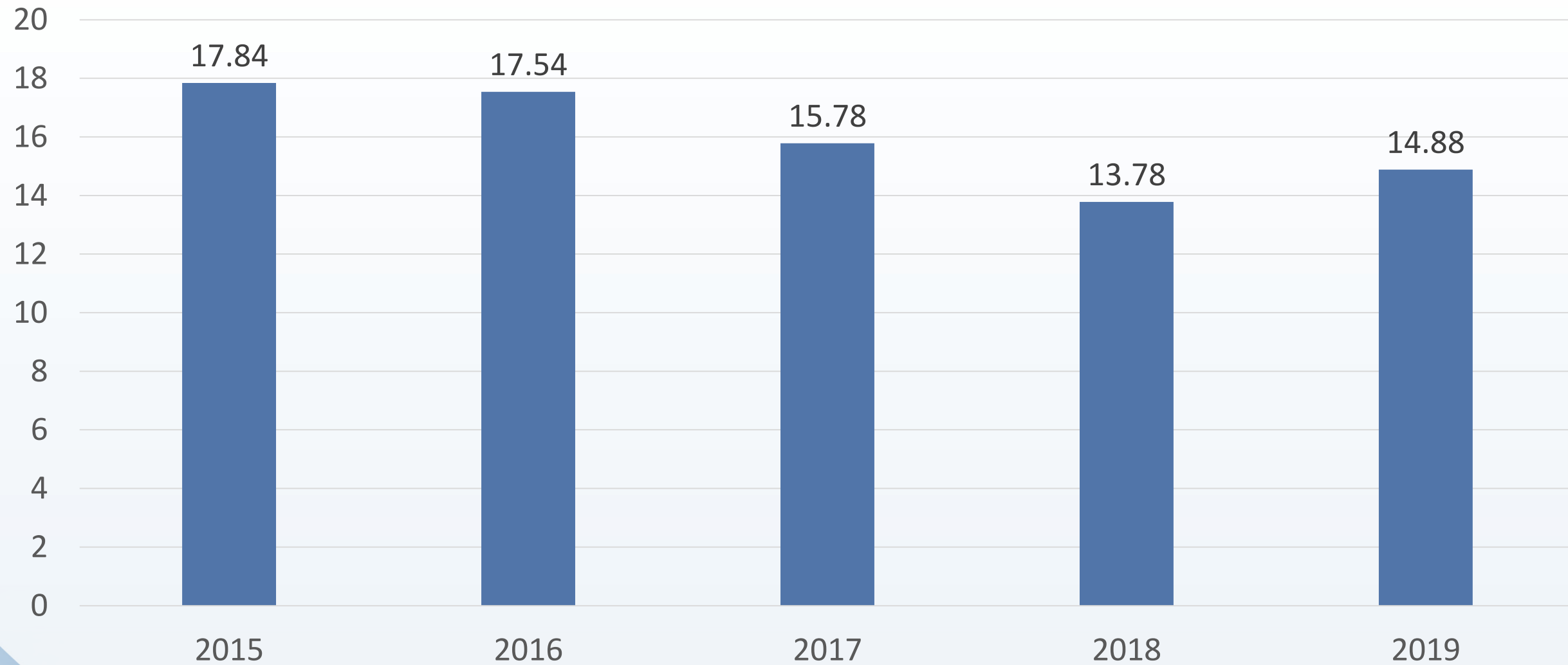

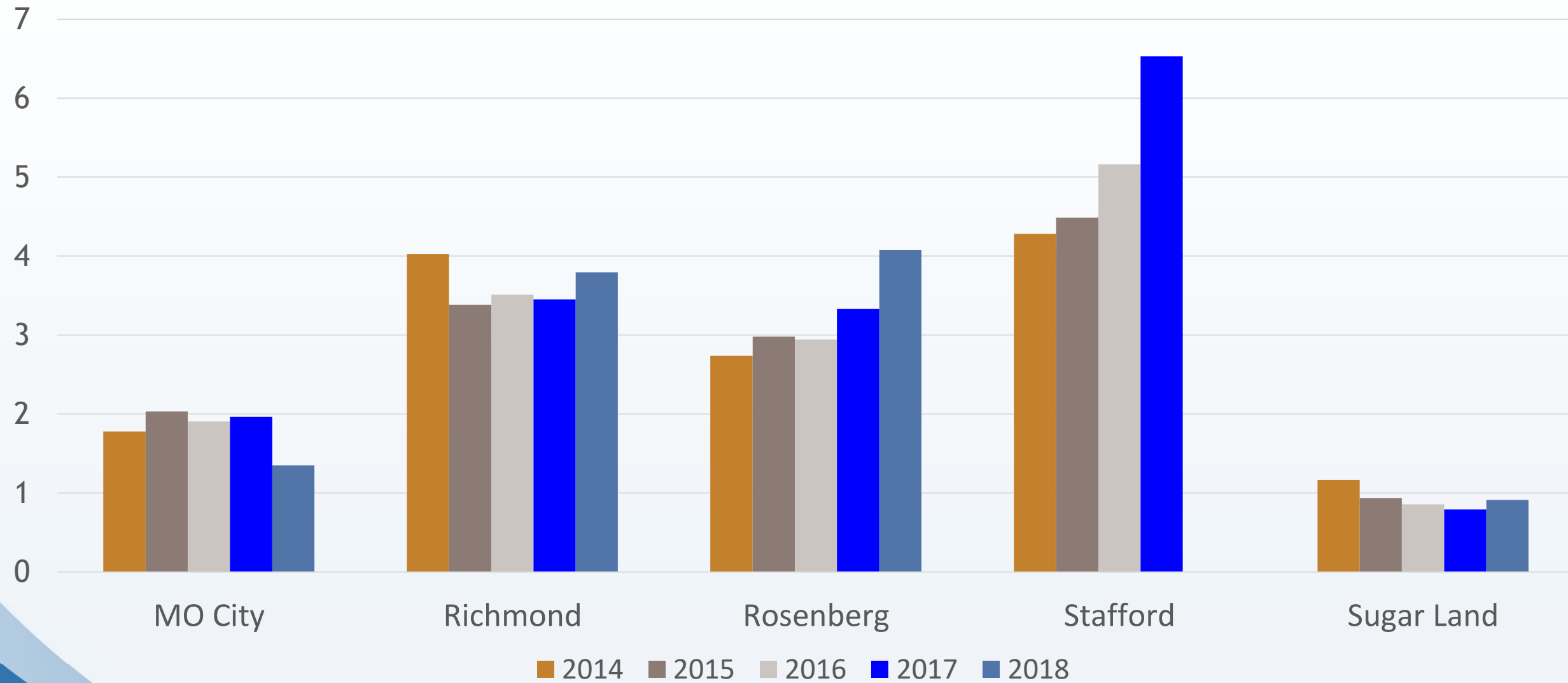

- 2018 was our lowest crime rate ever recorded (using City/US Census population)

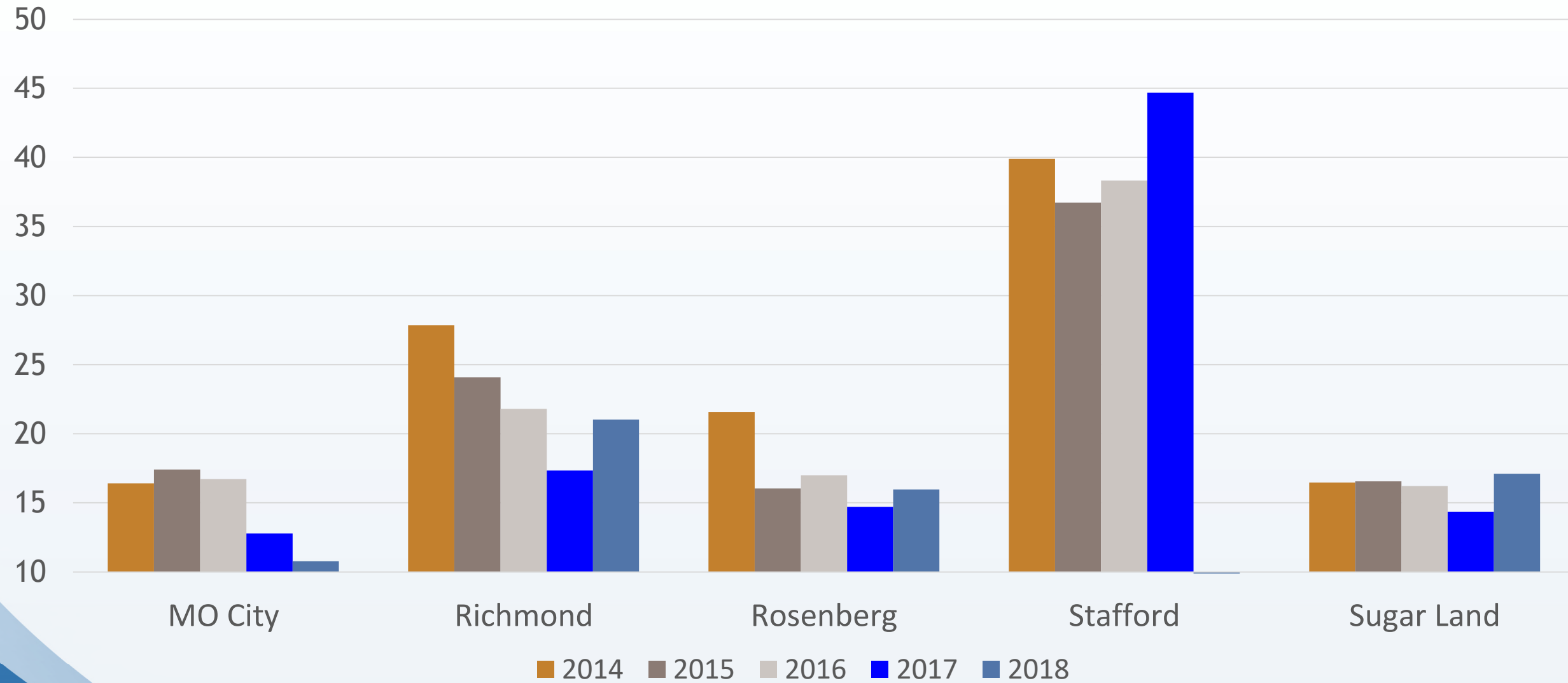

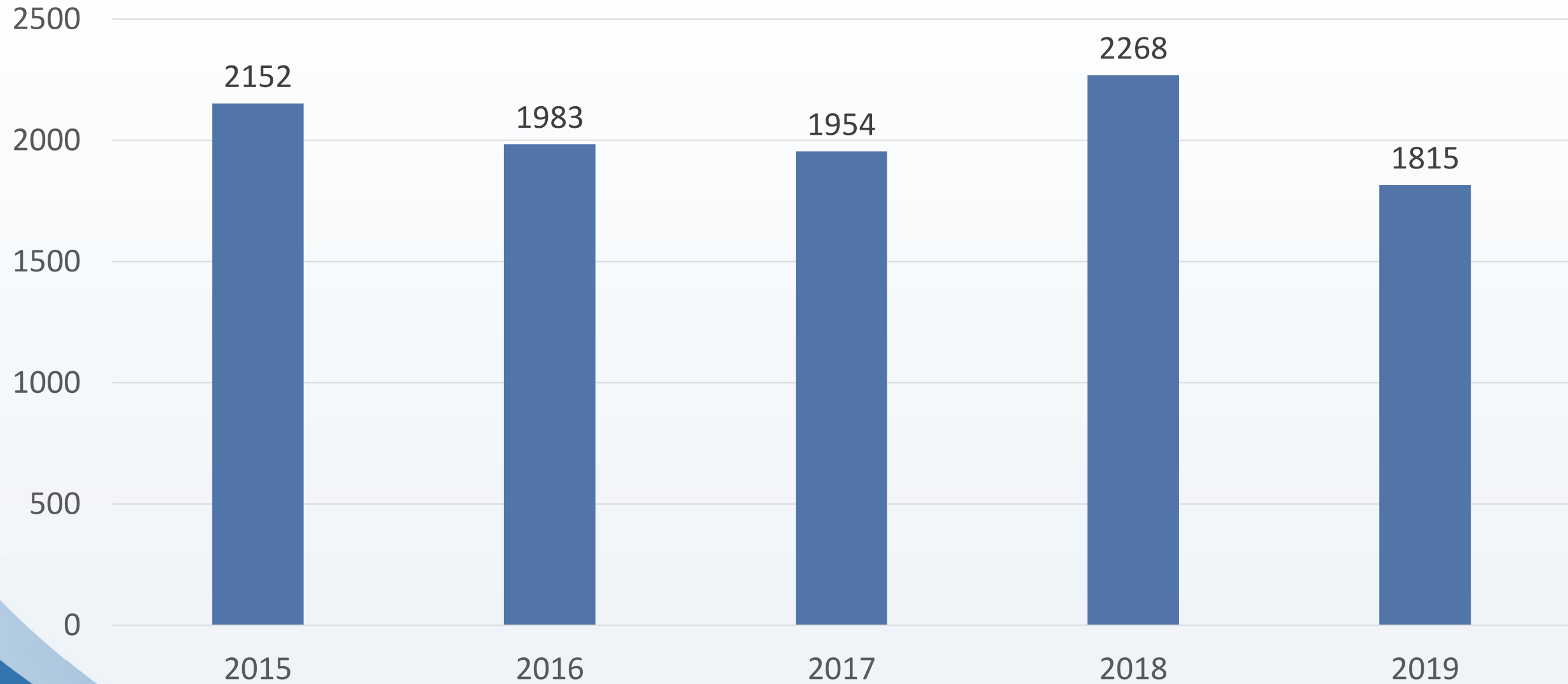

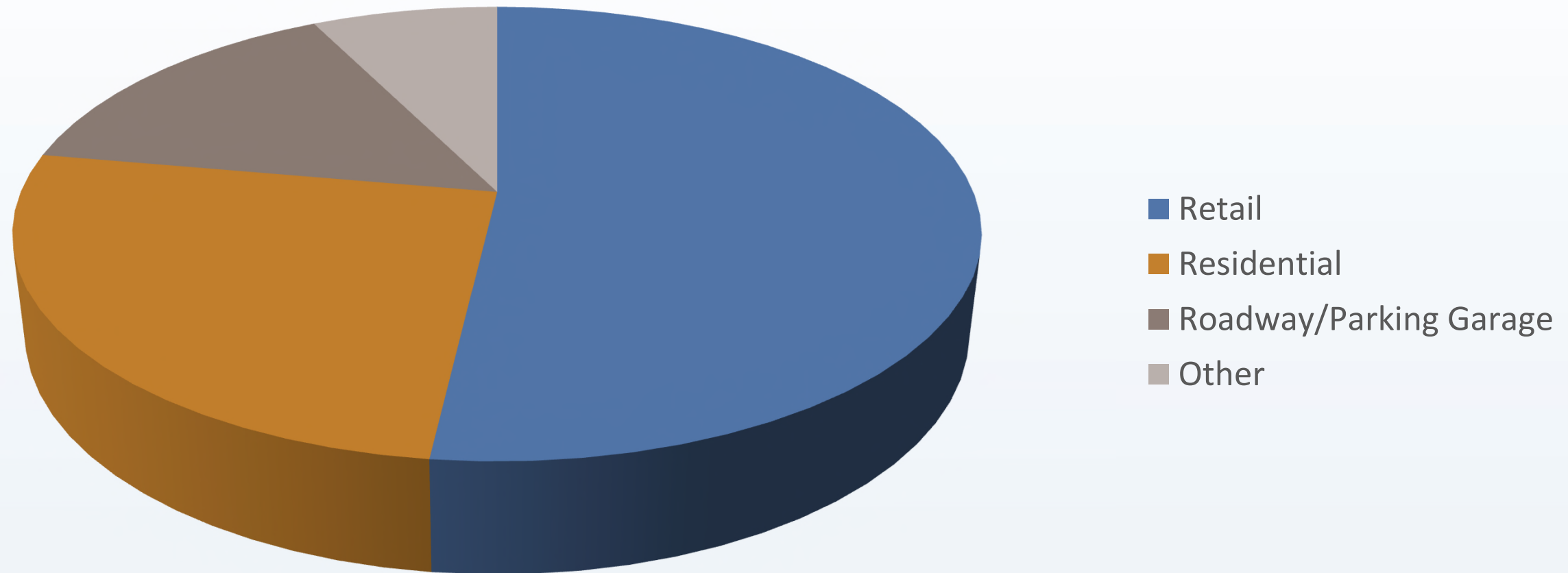

Custodial Arrests 2015 - 2019



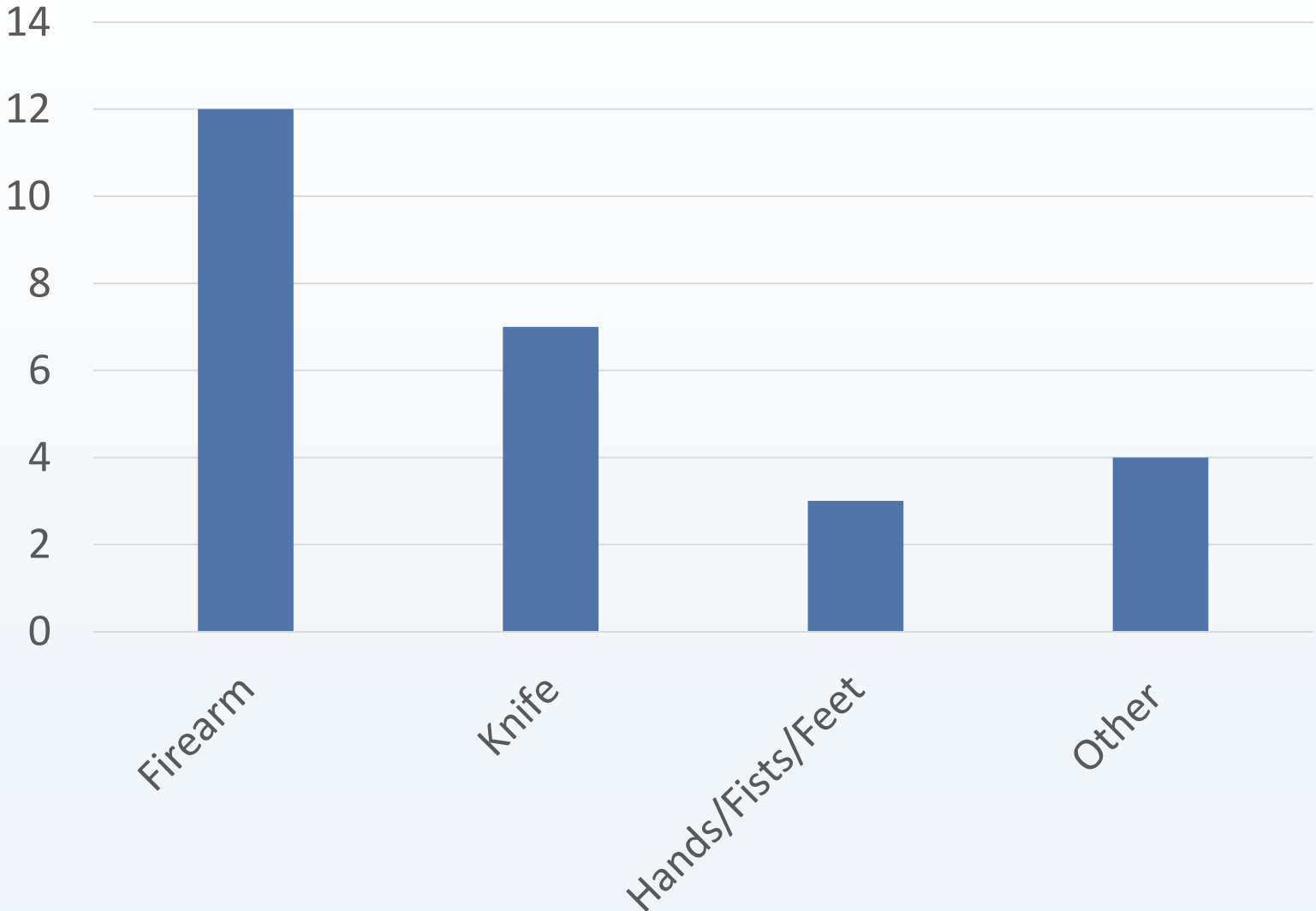
Robbery

Robberies decreased from 44 in 2018 to 27 in 2019



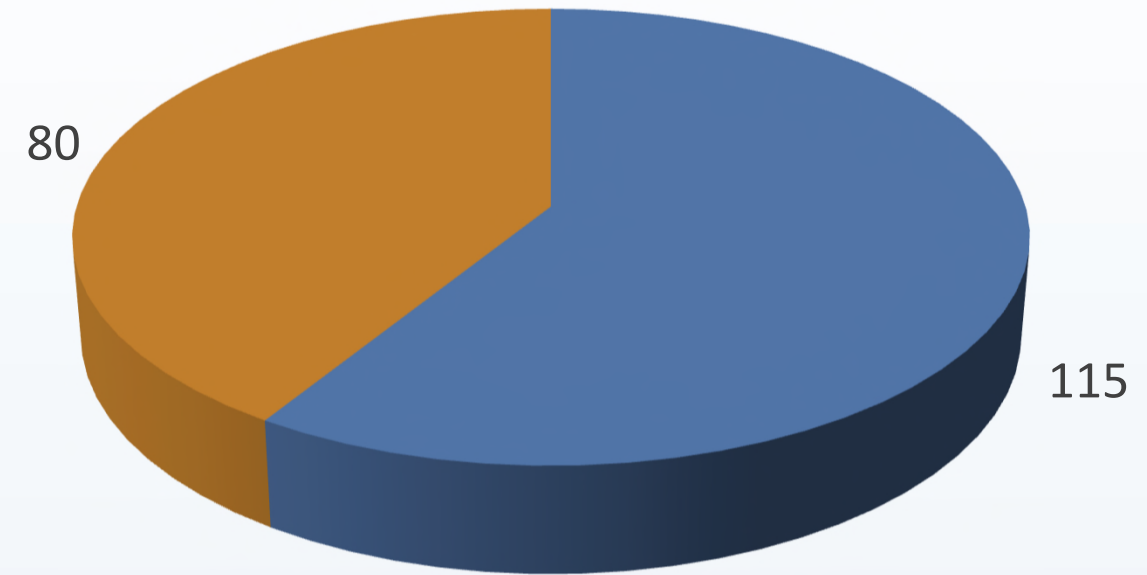
Aggravated Assault

- Aggravated Assaults increased from 16 in 2018 to 24 in 2019
- 54% were family violence



Burglary

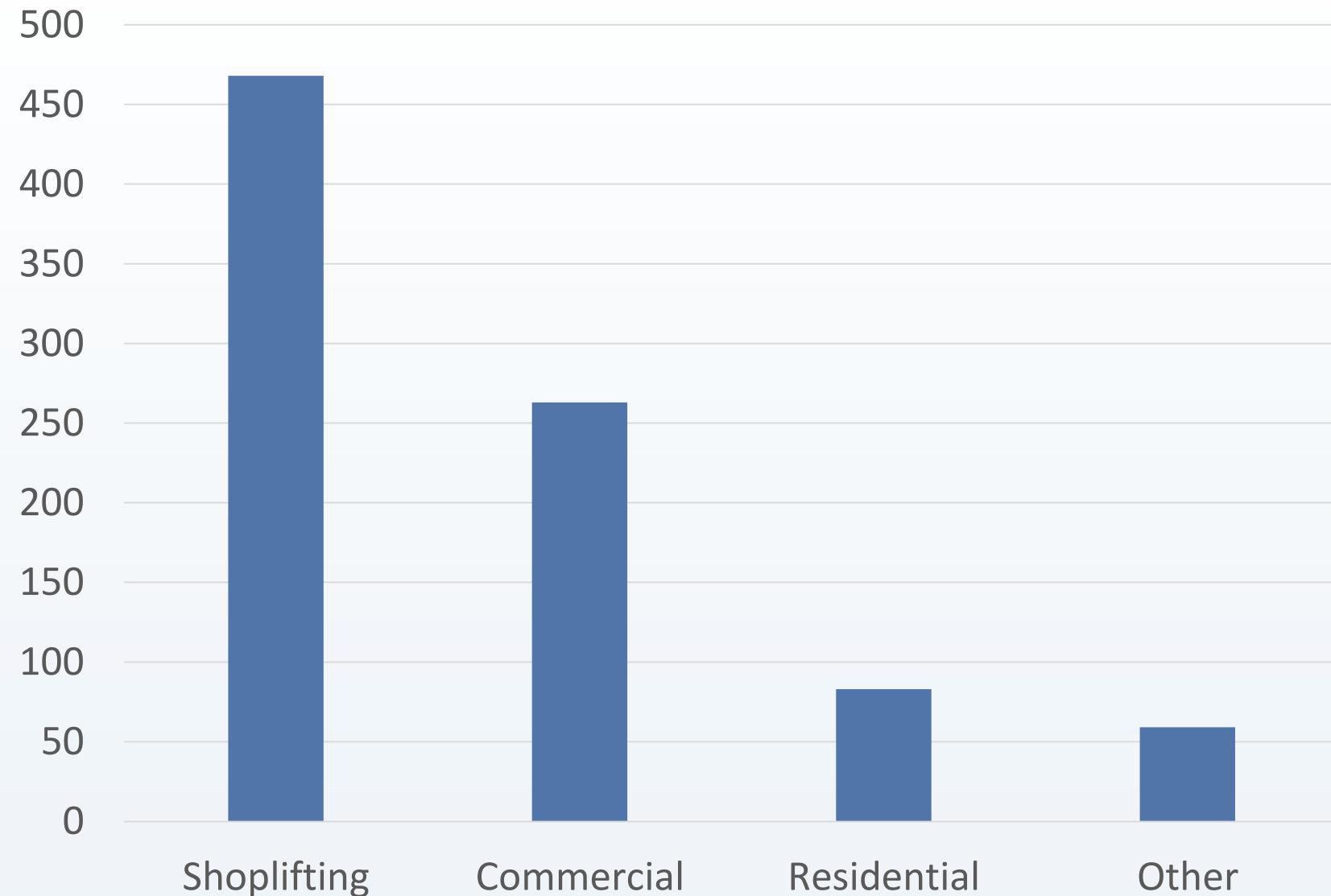
- Burglaries increased from 186 in 2018 to 195 in 2019
- 59% of burglaries were in residential areas
- Commercial burglaries increased from 58 in 2017 to 80 in 2018
- Residential burglaries decreased from 128 in 2018 to 115 in 2019



■ Residential ■ Commercial

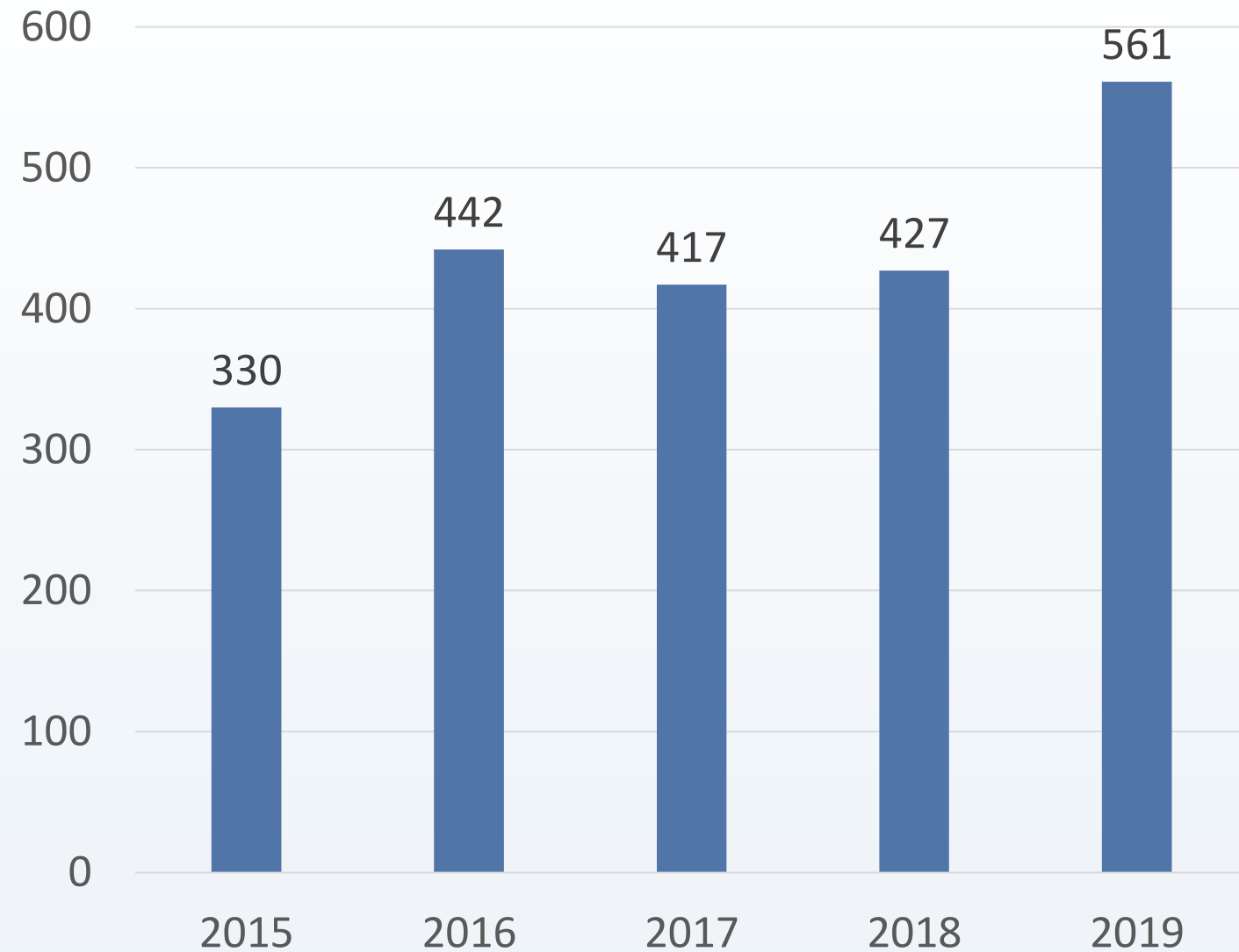
Theft with BMV Removed

- Shoplifting accounts for 32.6% of thefts



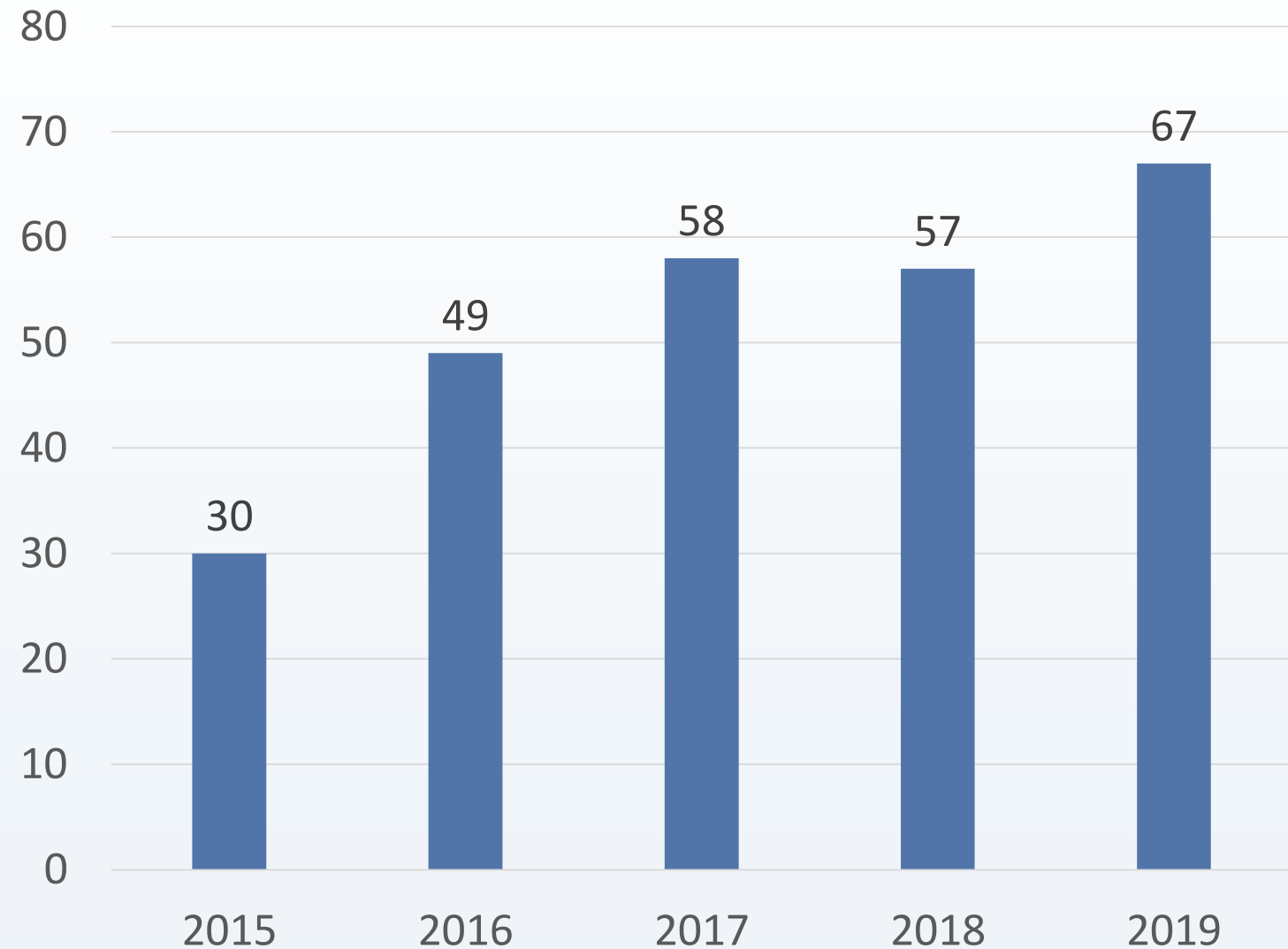
BMV

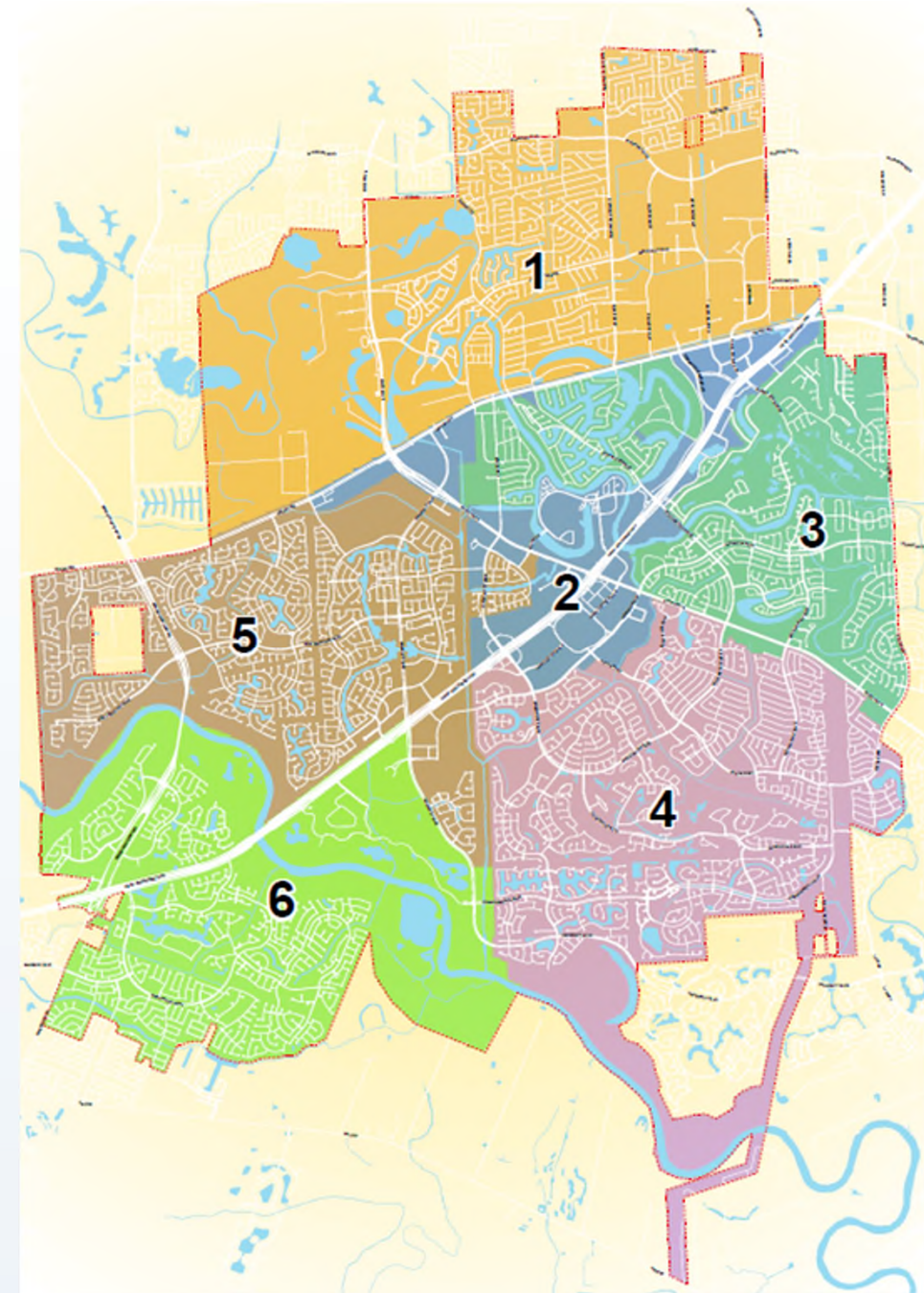

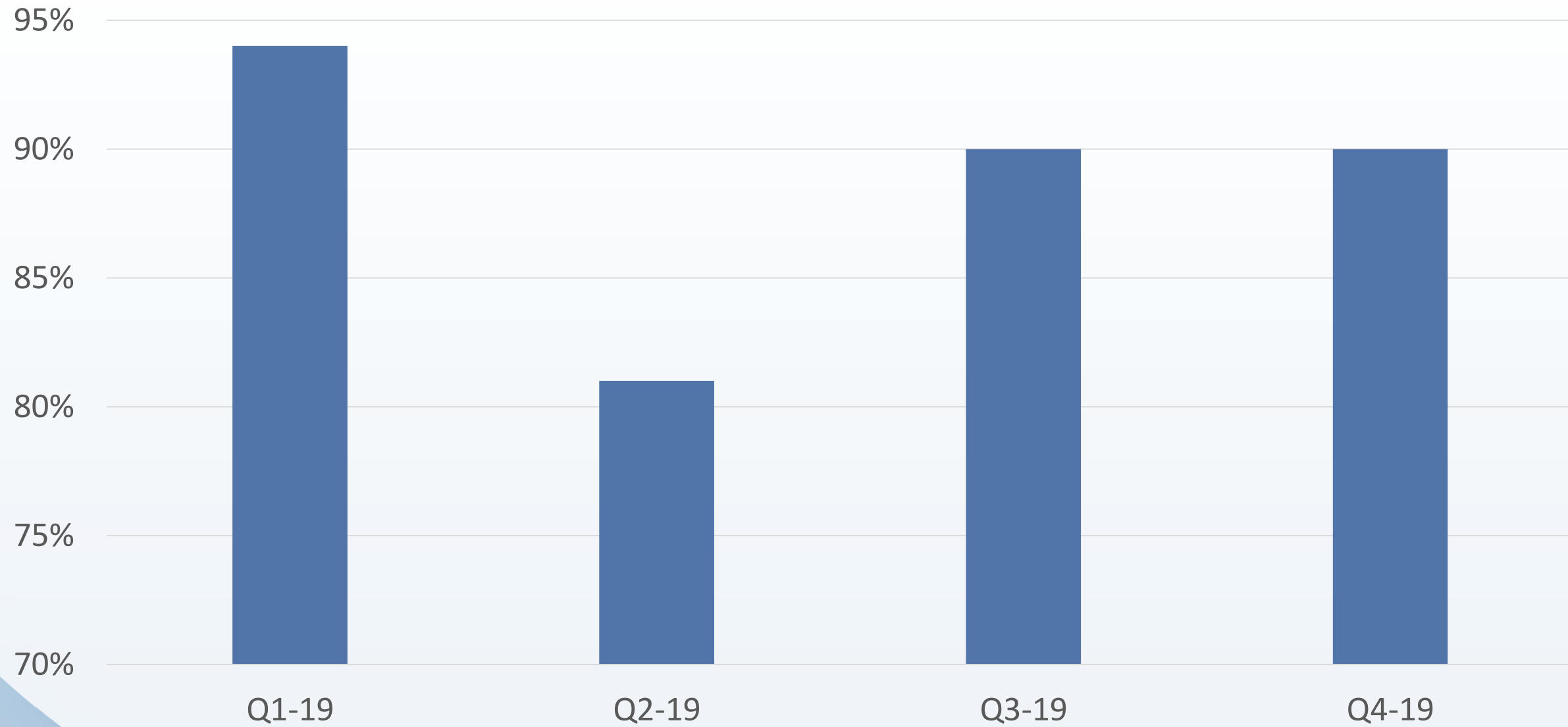

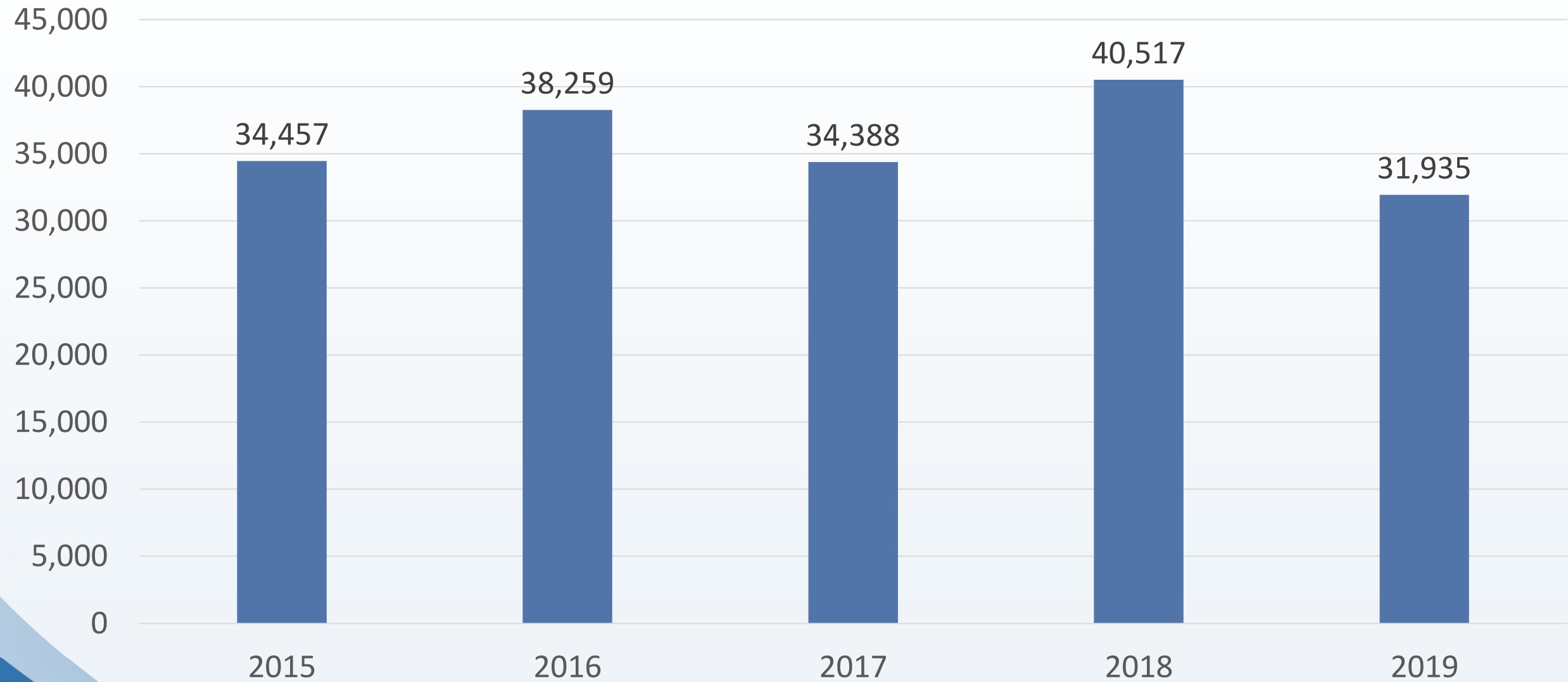

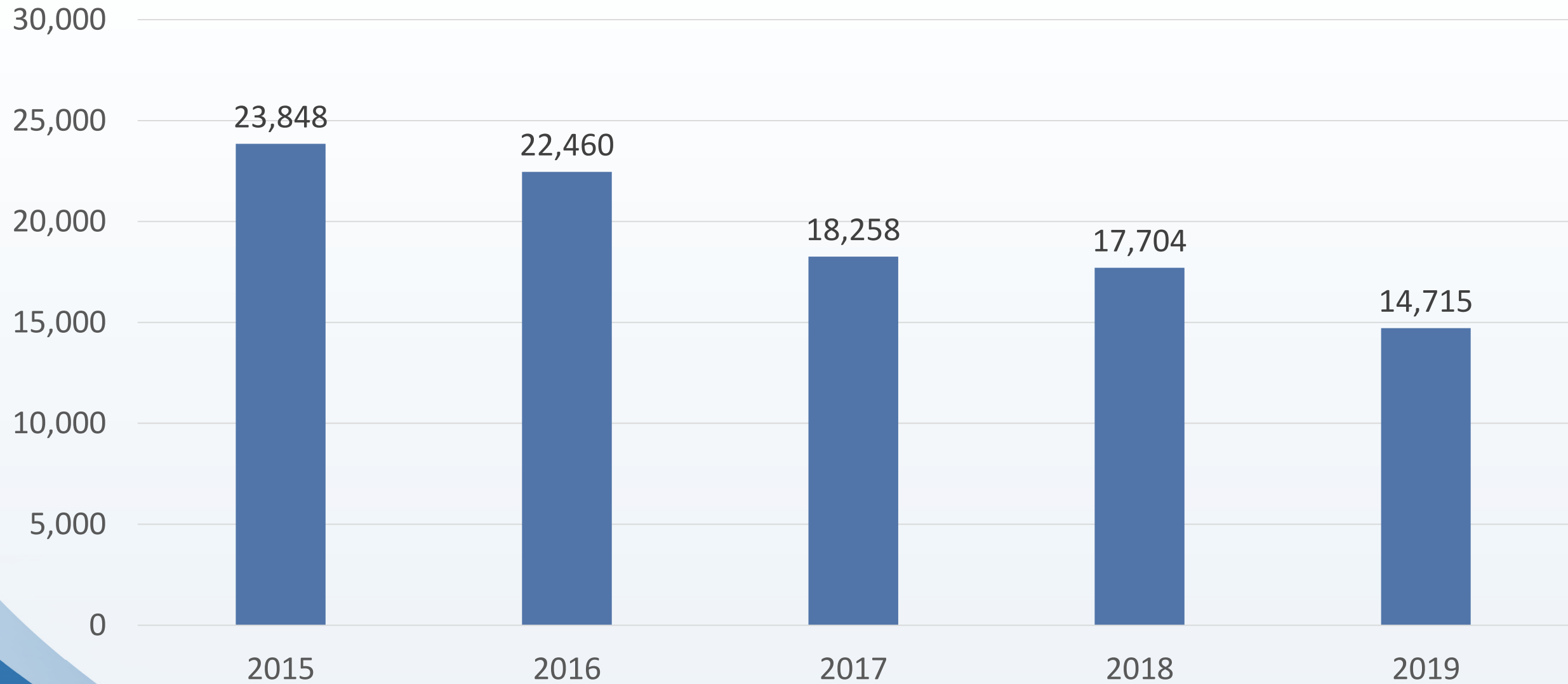

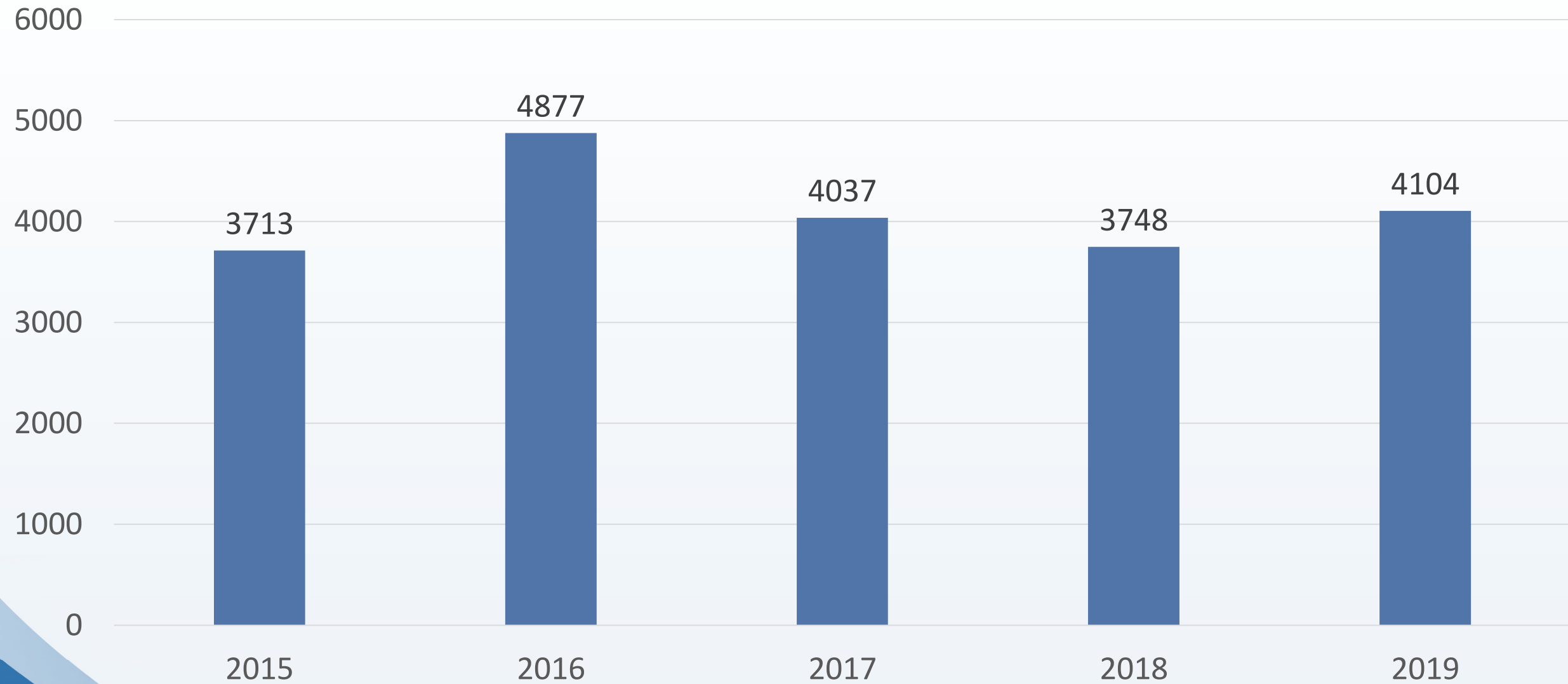
Number of Traffic Stops



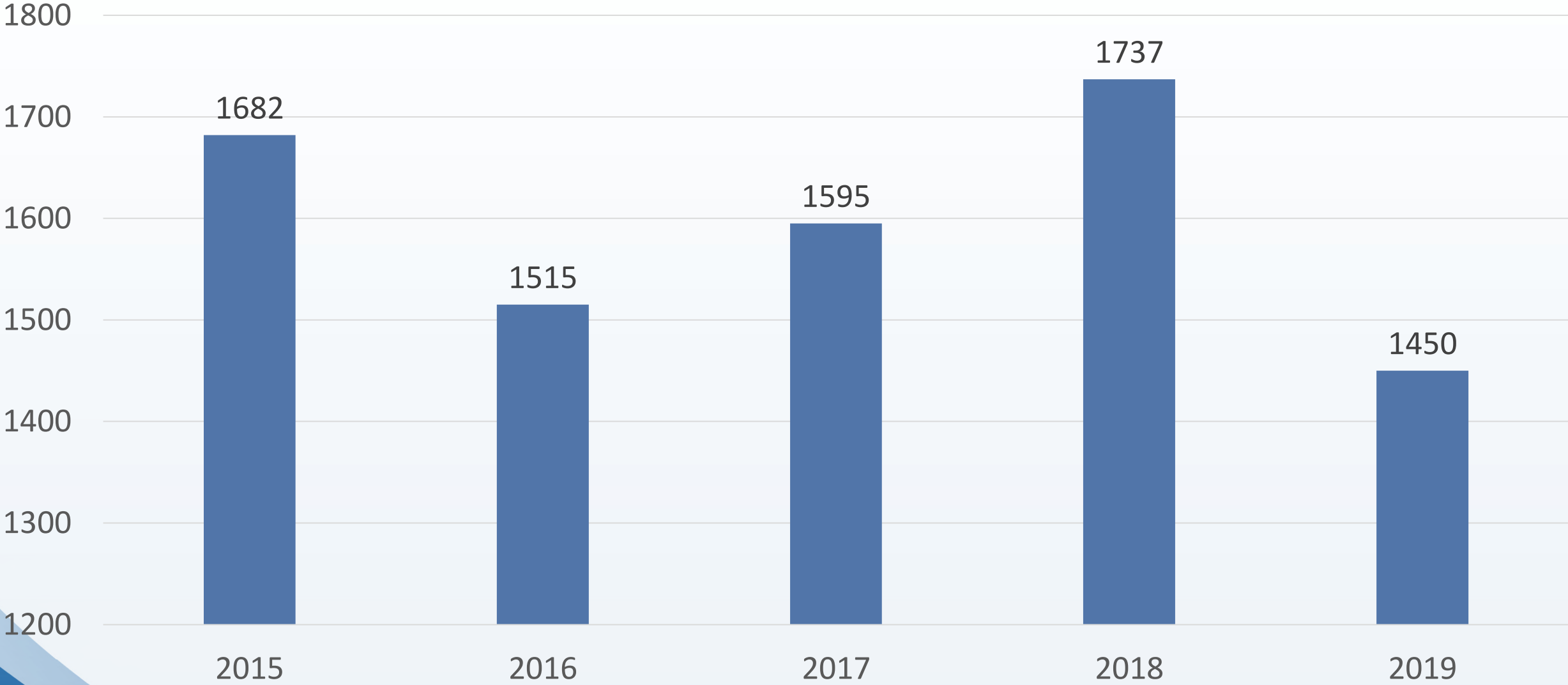

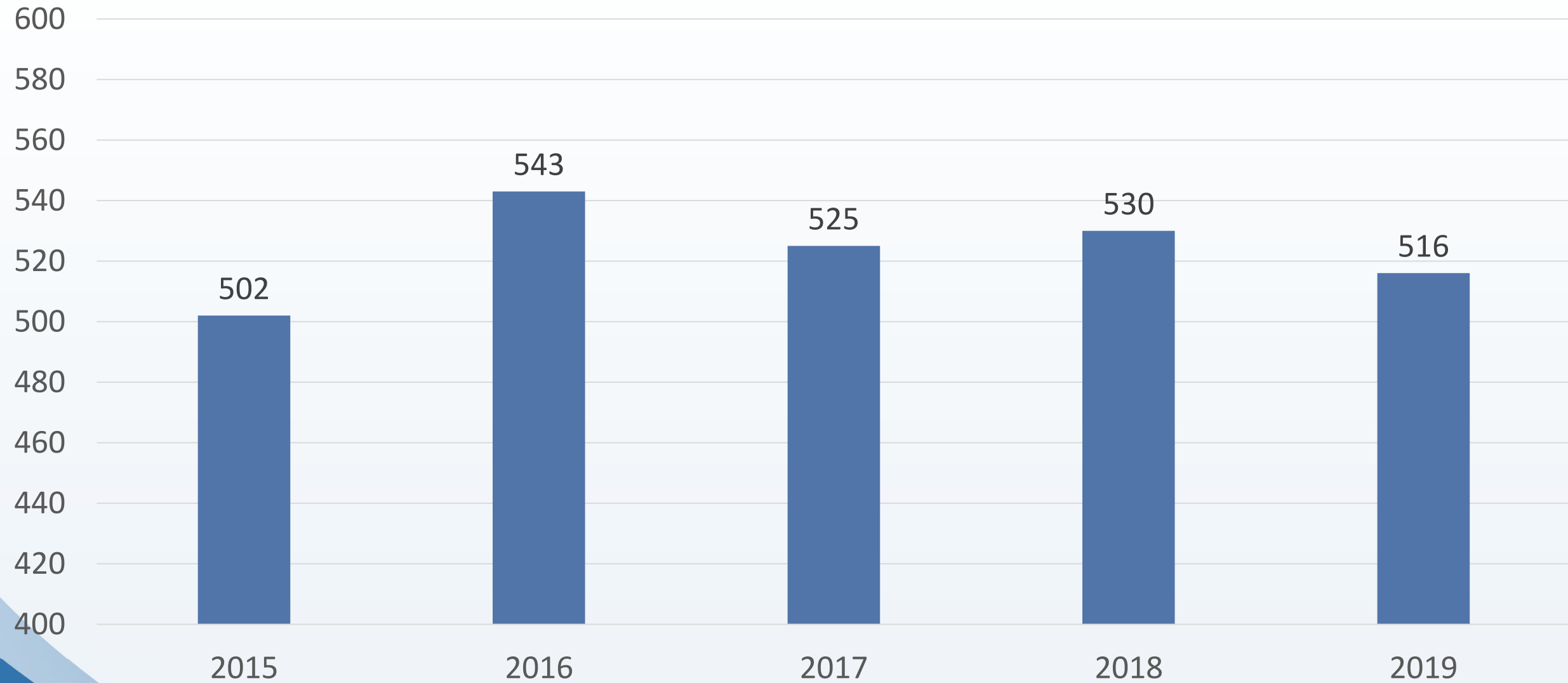
Traffic Citation Warnings Only



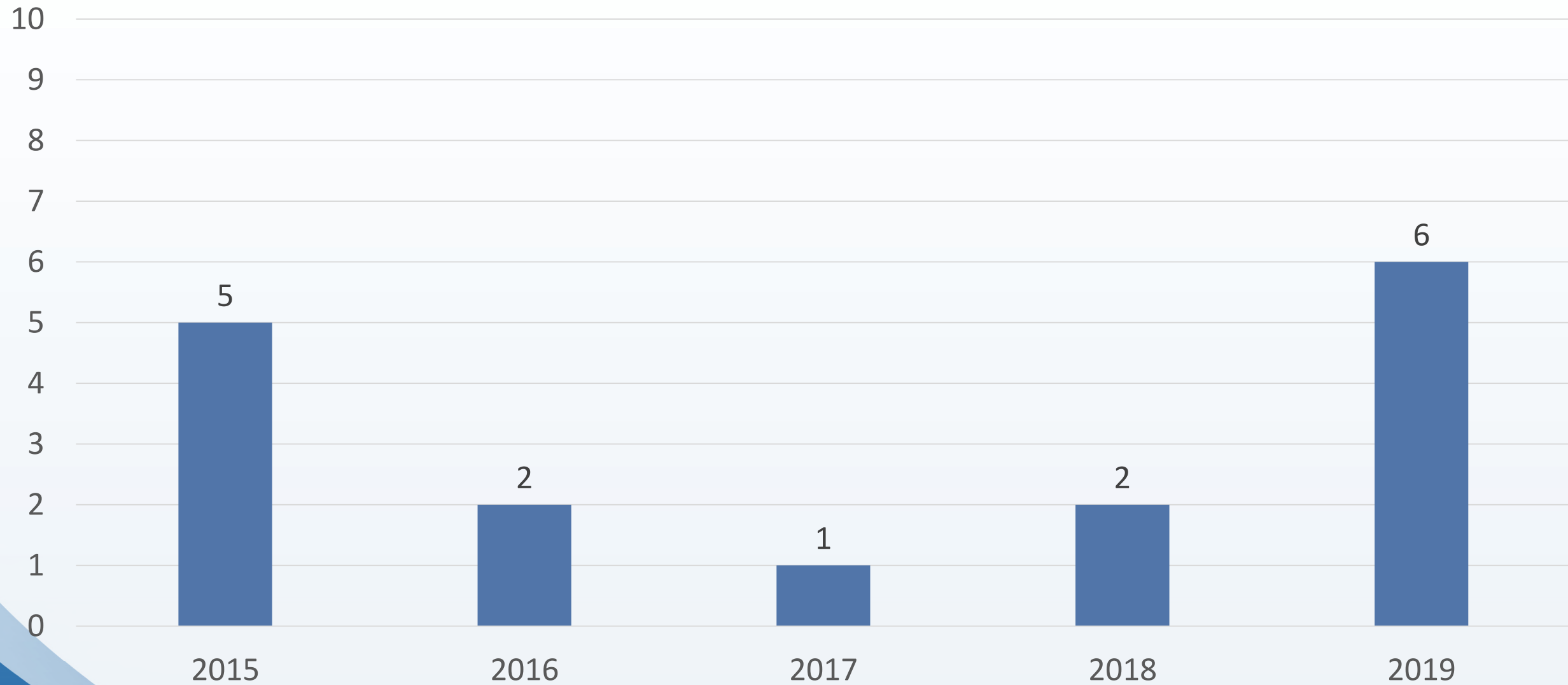

Decommission of Red Light Cameras

- Per Texas House Bill 161, red light cameras were banned from operating on June 2, 2019
- As a result of the ban on red light cameras, staff has conducted an assessment of traffic enforcement efforts without RLC's

Assessment of Former RLC Intersections

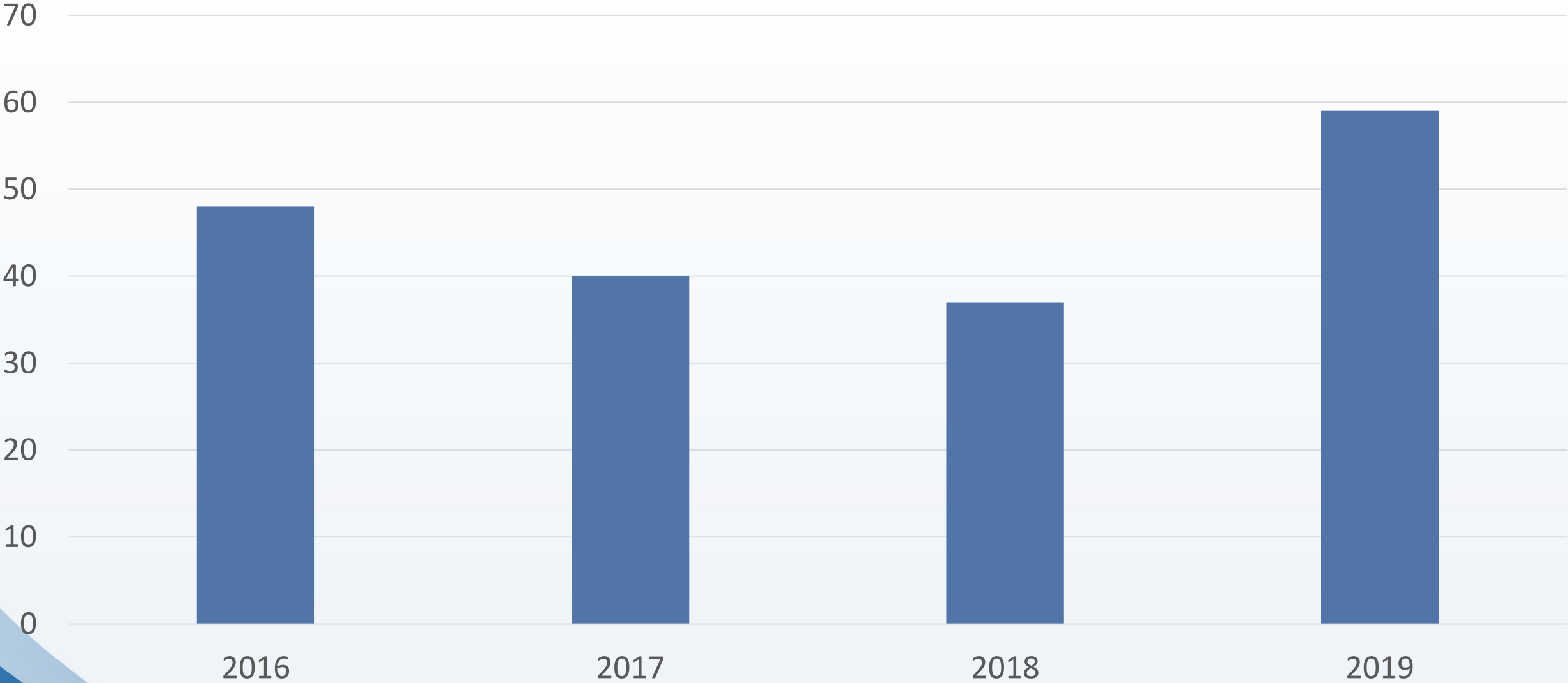
- Traffic officers (7/8/19 – 1/9/20)
 - Total of 236 hours worked during morning & evening rush hour
 - 287 traffic stops conducted
 - Average of 1.2 traffic stops per hour
- Red light cameras
 - Average of 5.5 violations viewed per hour (7/1/17 – 6/30/18)

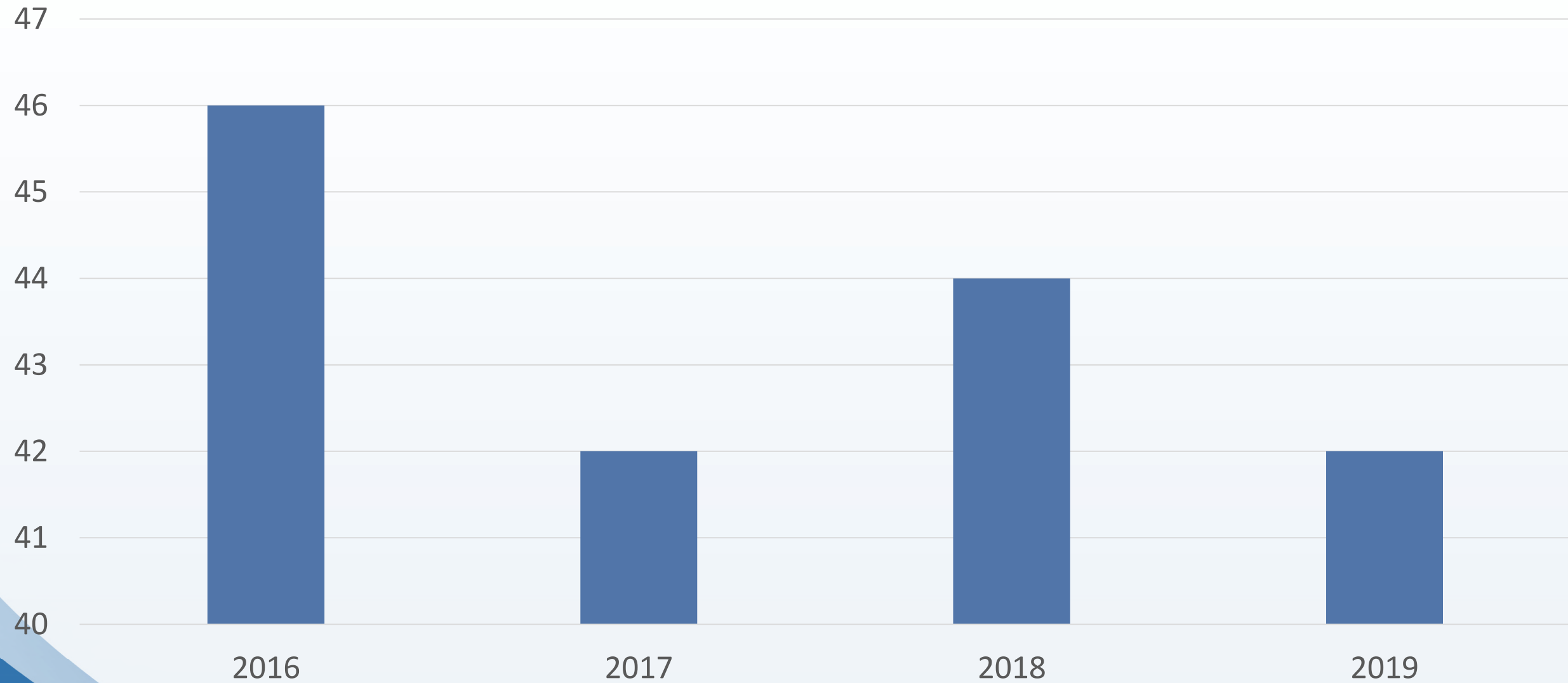

2019 Accomplishments

- Part I Crime Rate was 2nd lowest ever reported
- Criminal Investigations maintained a clearance rate above State and National level
- SLPD implemented all non-budgetary recommendations from the Center for Public Safety Management study
- SLPD transitioned to National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) ahead of FBI's deadline

2019 Accomplishments

- SLPD passed its Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) Audit
- Sugar Land Crime Lab received accreditation through the American National Standards Institute for forensic laboratory investigation and fingerprint examination
- SLPD is seeking its 7th 4-year re-accreditation through Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA)

2019 Accomplishments

- SLPD began participating in Fort Bend Seniors Meals on Wheels in April 2019
- SLPD participated in more National Night Out Parties compared to 2018
- SLPD increased firearms training thanks to the building of the gun range
- SLPD increased staffing by 3
